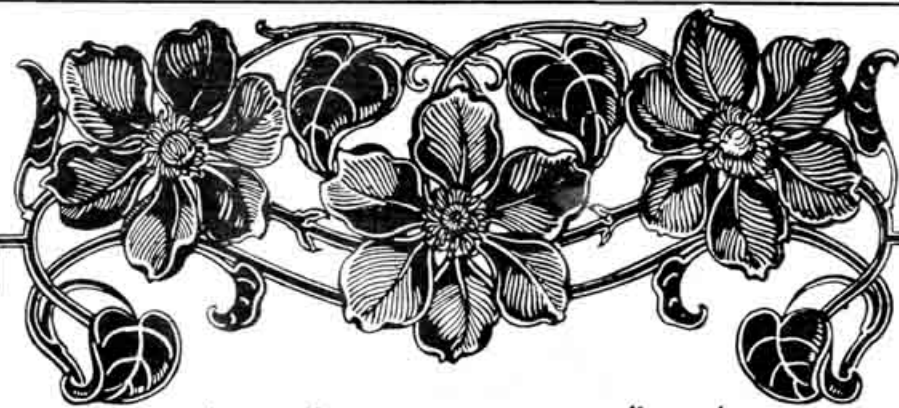

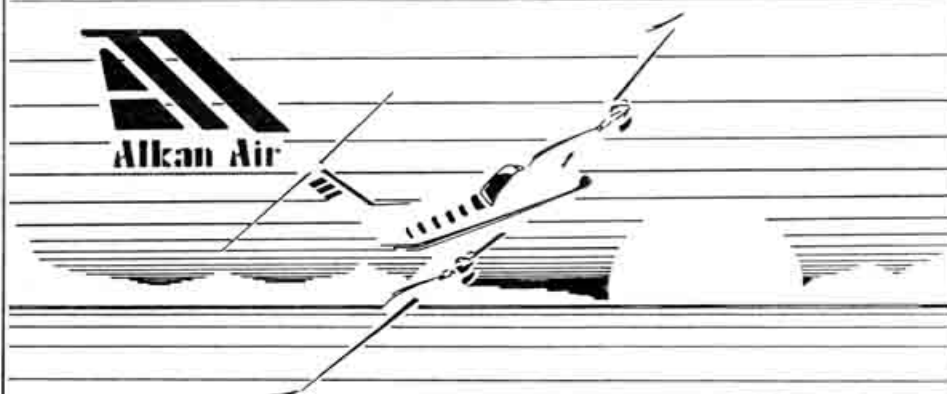

Bourne and MacLeod

If you've had your radio turned to the C.B.C lately you have probably heard this western Canadian duo. Fresh from taking the 1991 Juno for Best Roots/Traditional Recording, their act is going places. The rich salty blues voice of Bill Bourne blends surprisingly with the pipes and flute of Alan MacLeod. The music is cajun, blues and folk with a few Scottish pipe licks thrown in. Joining them is Jim Morison on Bass. Promises to be a great show.

What to eggpect? With names like Henrey Cabot Henhouse, Chick Korea, Chicken Little, Rhode Island Red and another fresh outta his shell, it should be an eggciting eggperience eh?



Crash Test Dummies

This Winnipeg based band has received national radio and television airplay for their Celtic influence tunes. Brad Roberts provides the lyrics and mixes his raspy baritone voice for some sweet harmonies with fellow band member Ellen Reid. Brother Dan lays down the bass line with Mitch Dorge filling out the rhythm section. The harp and guitar of Benjamin Dorvill add to what is a much awaited act.



Ralph Towner

This legendary musician has performed at Carnegie Hall and has collaborated with the likes of Jan Hammer, Freddie Hubbard, John Abercrombie, and the Weather Report. Towner was a founding member of the progressive jazz group, "Oregon," and his signature song, "Icarus," was made famous by the Paul Winter Consort. He is renowned in the jazz world as a master of improvisation on the guitar. Using his classical composition training as a stepping stone, Towner leaps into the unknown with his recent album, "City of Eyes." After many years of waiting, we are excited that Ralph will be joining us this year and look forward to his performances.



Rocki Rolletti & the Junior NoodleWave

This 6' 4" musician likes to rocki and rolli with his band "the old kids on the block". Rocki, also known as Peter Jordan in some circles, will pelt out a humorous act which includes interesting spoofs of popular songs. A veteran of the Prince George, Calgary and Regina children's folk festivals, Rocki will perform fun rock and roll for the kids; but remember...no adults allowed unless accompanied by children.



Laura Smith

Combining poignant, sensitive lyrics with a voice that is able to reflect their emotion is no easy task, but one that is accomplished by Laura Smith. Now working out of Halifax, Smith's self styled music mixes folk with a touch of blues and sings a sorrowful acapella tune called "faceless wonder", with a passion that is sure to bring you to the edge of your seat. Laura's original compositions promise to intrigue all.

Ecka Janus

Here is a country and western singer with roots right here in Dawson, whose singing career began after being discovered in Edmonton. Now living and working in Whitehorse, Ecka has just completed recording a debut album of original material that promises to be sure success. Pick of the Litter, also from Whitehorse, will join Ecka for a performance that is not to be missed!

Old Crow Fiddlers

These guys should be encouraged to fiddle around. When it comes to traditional music for the fiddle, the Old Crow Fiddlers are the guys for the job. Marvin Frost provides the guitar work between the bows of Alan Benjamin and local favourite Charlie Peter Charlie. Make sure your shoes are laced up right 'cause these guys will move ya!

Wynona Sue and the Turnpikes

From way down in Moosenut Mtn. country comes Wynona Sue and the Turnpikes. If you like country with a bit of swing thrown in for good measure, then this act is not to be missed. Foot stomping tunes and the strangest get ups you ever did see make these visitors from the Nashville Galaxy (they get off on the Whitehorse exit) a must see!



Zumak

Tribal rhythms and melodies are mixed by this band, which is sure to make you want to get up and dance. Originating from Lillooet as the "solstice all night drum corps", Zumak, which means "spring salmon" in Salish, has since expanded the instrumentals used in their songs. Fraser Lang addresses many environmental concerns in the band's original compositions and the vocals of Bill Spencer along with sax, flute and congos make a funky concoction that is pure heart and soul.

Matthew Lien and Rick Perry

The music of these artists fit the Yukon like the northern lights or the midnight sun. Lien's keyboards and Rick Perry's acoustic guitar are always melodic, and on "Tune for a Loon" even a loon, crickets and frogs join in. The music of Lien draws from his time spent in the Yukon, and one of his songs "Kluane" is dedicated to the spectacular national park. Rick, now of Homer, Alaska, draws from his roots in the American South to add to the ingredients that make these guys a hot meal ticket!

Children's Songs of Midnight Sun

Anchorage residents Carol Lavrakas and Michael Riopel continue their efforts to uplift children through music and to raise funds to fight child abuse. The music has a message and is fun to sing along to. A great venue for families, they'll be at both the Children's Concert and the Family Concert.

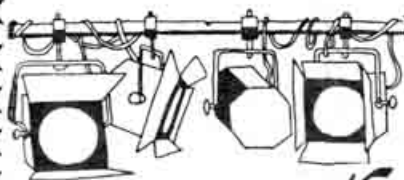

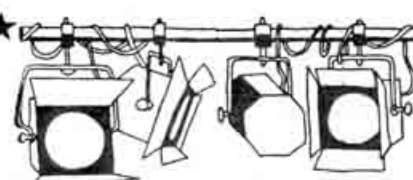
