NOUVEAU STATION WAGON

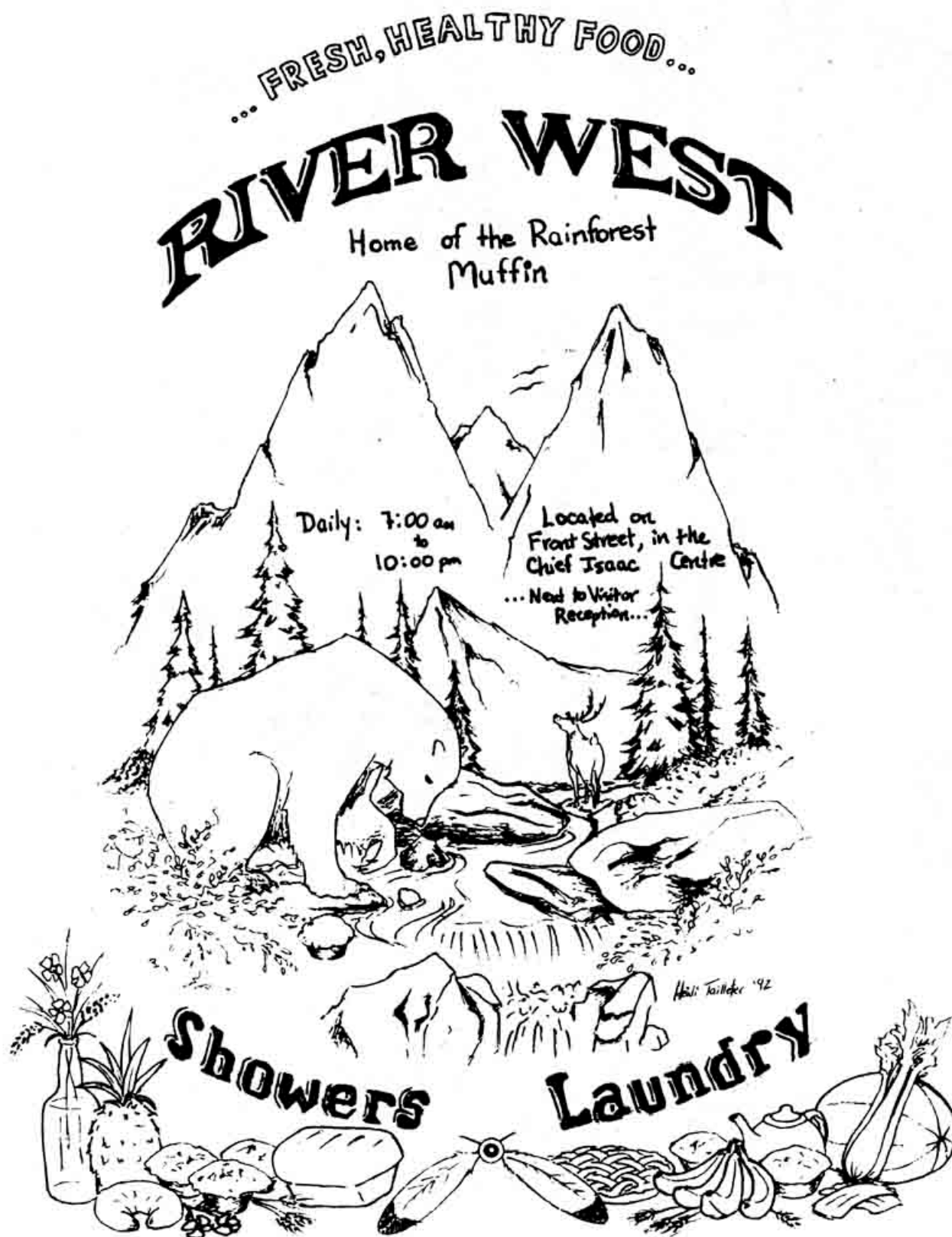
MATTHEW LIEN

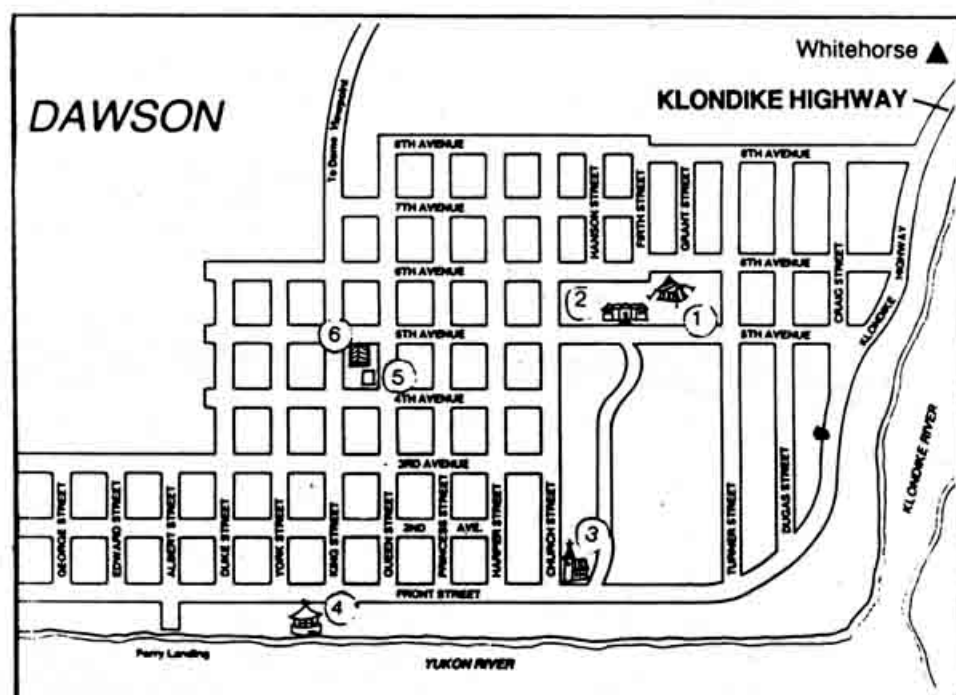

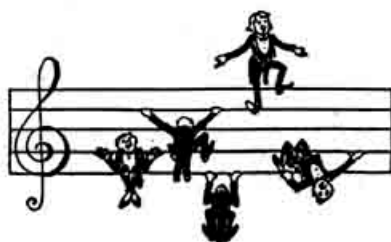

Canada's newest and hottest acoustic pop act is coming to Dawson. Still without a major label CD release, The Ladies have had a year of sold-out shows and enormous critical acclaim. Best known for their comical originals such as "Be My Yoko Ono" and "I'm in Love with a MacDonald's Girl."

RUSTY MAY

A most welcome addition to the Yukon's music scene, Rusty May has travelled far from Louisville, Kentucky to make her home in the Tagish area. Rusty plays a wild and wicked brand of swing violin. She will be accompanied by a troupe of accomplished musicians from Whitehorse (otherwise known as the No Name Band).

KEVIN BARR

Kevin has performed at most of Dawson City's music festivals over the past eight years that he has resided in the Yukon, but under many different names (most recently the Bergman/Barr Band and Pick of the Litter). This year he performs his special blend of country rock, with the No Name Band- Bob Hamilton, Dave Gilmore, Bruce Bergman, Marc Paradis and Rusty May.

TAMARACK

Since 1979, Tamarack have been the delight of folk loving audiences all across Canada, telling tales of sadness, bad luck and hard times. Their musical and lyrical wit keeps you longing for even more of their cheerful misery. Lately they are bringing more original songs, while staying true to Canadian folk music roots. Hailing from various Southern Ontario towns, James Gordon, Alex Sinclair and Melanie Doane will be a treat for young and old Klondikers alike.

NAPOLEON

Art, a Woodland Cree from Northeastern B.C., writes songs about the environment, the hunting and trapping lifestyle of his people, and of the various issues and challenges facing not only aboriginals but all Canadians. From a historical ballad to a traditional Cree love song, Art's singing combines the old and new in a unique style. Art uses the rich storytelling and musical traditions of his ancestors as a base for providing not only powerful melodies laced with haunting chants, but a powerful message as well.

CIRCUMPOLAR SWING BAND

The Circumpolar Swing Band from Whitehorse is a real old times Big Band, numbering no less than 18 musicians. Founded to play at the Eighth International Congress on Circumpolar Health in 1990 they just couldn't stop after that. Neither will your feet when you hear their 30's to 50's swing and jazz.

MELANGE

True to their name, these eight musicians from Whitehorse combine to produce a full sound. Their background experience ranges from theatre and movies to classical ensembles, country, jazz and swinging rock. They explore a wealth of noise making instruments (some horns included) and managed to polish the result into really danceable music. Don't be scared off because they have some real theoreticians in the group; they are doing great, and they do it bilingually too.

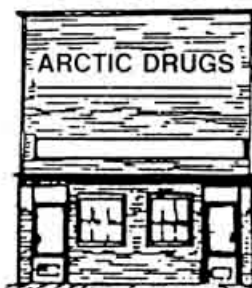
