# High Water plagues waterfront traffic

The George Black Ferry drifts well downstream as it fights against a stronger than normal current these days. The current, normally about 7 knots in the fastest channel, seems to be running at about 9 knots during this high water period, and is full of debris.

One commuter waiting for the ferry joked that there was probably a log cabin going by every hour.

To avoid the tree trunks, the ferry is scudding over near the Dawson shore and then beating its way back to the landing.

It's had to change tactics a few times in the last few days as the original landing washed out and was replaced by a different approach ramp on Monday. By late that day the replacement ramp was looking pretty muddy and, sure enough, by Tuesday, it was submerged, leaving a small spit of land beside a large pile of dirt and gravel that had been placed there to reinforce it.

By Tuesday, enough gravel had been trucked to the site to rebuild a truncated approximation of the original landing.

The crew had to improvise

some extra wooden support coming off the metal ferry ramps so that larger RVs could make land without bottoming out, but hey were making it.

The Klondike Spirit paddlewheeler is sitting on Front Street next to the ferry landing because the land where it had been sitting is now under water. It's the second time the boat has had to be moved up there. It was threatened by ice just after break-up the week of May 15, but had been able to return to that spot until the river rose up to claim it.

It can't sit at the city dock, which did get put in very quickly this year, because the dock is flooded. All land approaches to the dock are under water, way more than in recent years, and the passenger access ramps are swamped.

In previous years when the ramps have been awash it has been possible to place extensions to the land so that they could still be used. At present this would be impossible.

## Uffish Thoughts: Let's confine the Senate debate to real information

In the rush to attempt to regain the high ground in the great Senate debate, there have been some good and bad points made on both sides. One could wish that both sides could throttle back a bit on the finger pointing and focus on ways to make the system work.

Because, let's face it, we have a Senate and it's not something we can easily get rid of.

The Senate is built into our constitution. Abolishing it would require a constitutional amendment, and anyone old enough to recall the Patriation debates under Prime Minister Trudeau, or the two accords that Prime Minister Mulroney tried to broker, knows that amendments are next to impossible.

The existence of the Senate grants a certain presence in Ottawa to places like the three territories and the Atlantic Provinces that would otherwise not have that extra voice. Since the provinces would have to agree to abolish the Senate, and only Saskatchewan has shown any appetite for that from what I've read, it's just not likely.

There are measures that can be taken to democratize the institution somewhat. Alberta has had some Senatorial candidates selected by popular vote, but having that work depends on the willingness of

the reigning Prime Minister give up some of his or her authority and accept the results even when they come from a different party.

Most Prime Ministers only appoint senators from their own party. The exceptions to this rule have been Sir John A. Macdonald, John Thompson, Pierre Trudeau and Paul Martin, and even they didn't go outside the party lines often. Everyone else has tended to appoint strictly along party lines.

Prime Minister Chretien appointed three independents along with 72 Liberals during his years. Prime Minister Harper has had the Governor General's office appoint 59 Conservatives, the most recent one having been selected by a process used only in Alberta.

So that can be done, provided the PMO will agree to abide by whatever decision is taken, even if it means appointing people other than failed candidates and backroom persons from the party in power.

The other thing that can be done is to clean up some of the procedural rules in the Senate, especially those which have led to the problems in the cases of former Conservative Senators Mike Duffy, Pamela Wallin and Patrick Brazeau, as well as Liberal Senator Mac Harb.

The Conservative Senate Leader Marjorie LeBreton has

offered up a list of 10 procedural changes that look pretty good and should eliminate some of the problems. They have to do with following common sense accounting procedures and keeping better records related to travel expenses for legitimate Senate business.

Oddly, they don't include clarifying the residency rules, which were the loose thread that began to unravel all these other things lately.

The low point that followed the announcement of these new procedures was the attempt to smear the new Liberal leader, Justin Trudeau, with having taken a position against these changes.

The talking points issued by the PMO, and presumably issued as press releases in places other than the Yukon, don't even begin to make sense. The three paragraphs don't even link to each other in terms of logic and subject matter.

Trudeau has, in fact, said that he prefers an appointed Senate, but that he would like it reformed and would like to see changes in the way people are appointed.

The PMO's talking points ask us to believe that he therefore supports the status quo as regards the Senate, and is therefore opposed to the new Senate Accountability measures.

In fact, the speech they

quoted out of context goes on to say that "nobody who has watched the goings on in the Senate over the past year could possibly support the status quo" (quoted in MacLean's)

It's all very well to disagree with policy positions that someone has actually put forth, but it's not acceptable to build up a straw man opponent with inaccurate references and attack that as if it were a real target.

The point of the exercise, of course, is to change the subject, to get us to stop wondering about the sins of the Duffman et al and the role of the PM's former chief of staff, Nigel Wright, in the entire affair.

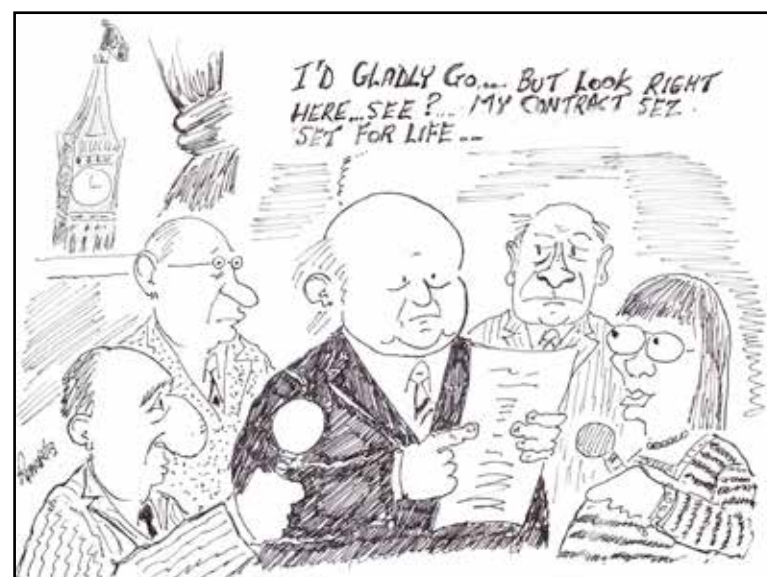
Just today, as I was outlining

this column, Member of Parliament Brent Rathgeber, explained why he was leaving the Conservative Party caucus.

"When you have a PMO that tightly scripts its backbenches like this one attempts to do, MPs don't represent their constituents in Ottawa, they represent the government to their constituents," Rathgeber told reporters. (CBC file)

I've used up a fair amount of ink here complaining about exactly this type of behavior at both the territorial and federal level over the last several years. It is with both worry and satisfaction that I watch my conclusions being confirmed on the evening news.

### Thinking further along Ron's Rant: the Little People

Repeating history isn't easy with split-second modern communications and our petroleum hungry society playing with the commodity prices in a speculative, greedy and short-sighted world. I agree wholeheartedly with Ron Ryant in his resounding warning on exponential growth. His shared analogy to the reproduction rate of bacteria is bang on.

Others call it too many rats in the box. There is a tilting point where once the food is gone, they will cannibalize. Are WE there yet?

The difficulty today for the little miner, let's say a placer miner for example, is that he/she has become the political football of too many bureaucratic assessors and controllers who show little knowledge of the industry, but have every personal interest in stopping it.

When I advertise that all plans are now done for the placer miners, with humor, this triggers a reaction that any office can impose yet more plans, with voracity. Meanwhile, do the miners need those plans really? Do they read them? Do they read the hundreds of pages of laws and regulations that control them and can change at any moment? Hardly.

They are looking for gold, painstakingly, at their great expense. If they find it, they get mining in earnest, in a very short frost-free season.

Dawson is screaming loud and clear that attraction based on tourism, gambling, the pastoral dwellers who want a pristine wilderness devoid of humans, is losing its glamor. Right now we see who makes

the wheels turn, who employs the local and far-removed seasonal workers. These endangered species have a bleak future with the Conservatives' austerity measures for others, but not their cronies. Face it, seasonal workers are at risk of disappearing forever, along with their industries across the entire country, including this one here.

Driving 100 km in each direction to get to work in one day, with today's fuel prices, would be difficult or impossible. What will happen here is that the summer staff who must travel unbelievable distances at even more startling high costs won't be able to return each year. Miners employ students who can't find high-paying work at home; they leave in August, but the mining season stretches to October for many operations.

I smell a rat. The glowing comments reported in the May 29 issue of the *Sun* by politicians and big industry are subject to some skepticism if one is in the middle of the war zone to protect our "smaller" interests. And now front and foremost is the news even Class 1 activities must be duly reported to the Mining Lands people, also known as the Mining Recorder's office, or no exploration. A judge decided that in what appears to be a lead case in First Nations assertion of rights if they do not have a formal land claims agreement. This made front page this week in the bigger papers in Whitehorse.

In the past two years, if small miners needed a permit

to work, they were held to produce so many extraneous plans that it is a jungle. When these plans are produced, not easily, they are ignored by the emperors in their ivory towers. So why are we asked to produce these plans? Does anyone read them? The biggest danger there is the cynicism and smugness that is adopted in many offices. It's a trendy corporate culture we have.

There is no regard to protecting privacy of those who invest a large amount in the private sector. Like homeowners, their equipment may be mortgaged, and not paid for in cash with the expenses relegated to the assets side, they stay on the liability side for years. Because of the laundry on the internet clothesline, no one is safe from cyber-attacks or spamming ad infinitum.

Despite this, as the limited gold-rich ground is mined out, it becomes critical that the miners have the skill to understand their deposits and stay solvent. The resistance against small operators, limitations on their ability to test their ground with the permitting as it is, the parameters DFO and the Placer Secretariat have created prevents miners from touching creeks considered as viable fish habitat even if a fish hasn't been found there ever. But slimy sculpins still rule. They are the smallest denominator with the most power.

No matter how plans are created to avoid undue damage, with all the preventive means built-in, they are subject to scrutiny and sarcasm. Of importance is that now, a miner should know exactly where his

pay streak lies, and must stay within his submitted plan or else... That would amount to a 10-year sentence where you are found guilty without a just trial.

This shows a profound misunderstanding of the quest for surface gold. Delays for permit approvals are a risk that now must be calculated as a cost of doing business. Even if applications are filed in good time, the bureaucracy gives itself the power to stop or slow down the honest efforts to help move the miners towards optimistic prosperity.

Carefully, one should not generalize. Many government employees still carry a dedication and willingness to help where they can, and are very knowledgeable. This often applies to old-school, long-term employees who have witnessed the changing landscape. But do they have support from superiors? From other agencies? Not really. Most are looking forward to retirement and a well earned rest after 13 years of soul-searching and re-engineering.

Let's not forget the trauma of the Placer Authorization review of the early twenty-first century. Yes, this one. Now we have a review of the legislation, with the announced changes caused by a new precedent in Law. As it is, the government, in not consulting with all its subjects, is breaking the new Law, and there is a rush to re-write legislation by December 27, 2013.

The hard rock exploration ventures and needed capital-raising have deflated markedly. As the population ages and needs its investments to live on for the last years of life (and having now squandered their children's inheritances), the appetite for risk has vanished. So has the money these companies depend on to continue expensive exploration projects. Those big birds up there are very expensive now.

TransNorth General Manager Arden Meyer confirms the quiet reality. "Our business is definitely slower by considerably more than 50%, and last year we saw a drop of 50% in our bookings from the previous year (2011). We charge a dry rate (no fuel) for our charters which has not changed in over seven years. The customer absorbs the fluctuating rates for jet fuel. We are just refilling our tanks now at the higher costs, and we don't know what increase will result. We do notice the increase at the pumps when we fill up our vehicles."

That translates to fewer flights by exploration companies, fewer jobs for stakers, fewer samples taken, and fewer bullish investors. That means fewer big mines.

The last ones left standing up are the little people, exposed to inspectors with more time on their hands, who can afford the rental rates on our tab, with machines to watch from above, and a mission to catch people in "non-compliance". We all pay for those incriminating chopper trips.

So be wary of the gushy words and enthusiasm for our future. Without a strong economy shielded from commodity speculators, hedge funds and all those smart distant people, and with a chaotic climate where heating a home became prohibitive this year, use caution and be alert.

Disposable income just went the way of the dodo bird, straight out the window.

In my work, as someone who jumps through high hoops set by the elevated ones, I can tell you there is no such thing as a "miner-friendly jurisdiction", nor a full understanding of the disparate but mandated compliance demands. We are headed for disaster.


Having tried to live on clean, efficient alternative forms of energy in the Yukon, I learned that this is not an option unless one was born with silver spoons in mouth. A medium-capacity system for a small house (forget the microwave on solar power and batteries!) costs upwards of \$20,000. You still need propane to heat water. You depend on a generator to save your expensive batteries in the winter when there is no sun. And you have to heat your home with appliances that use very little energy. You got it, firewood at \$200 a cord, because apparently we are running out of that too.

Wind power requires a substantial amount of constant wind, at least 6 metres per second (21.6 km/h) year-round, 24 hours a day. And those big whirly gigs are not cheap, nor are they easy to maintain. The copper used to reach their often remote location is very very expensive, if someone doesn't steal the wires off the poles in the first week of operation.

The future is so bright one needs to wear BIG infra-red binoculars to see through the dark smoke screens.

When the placer miners are fully recognized for their contributions during the third gold rush, it'll be another 100 years. Patience is golden.

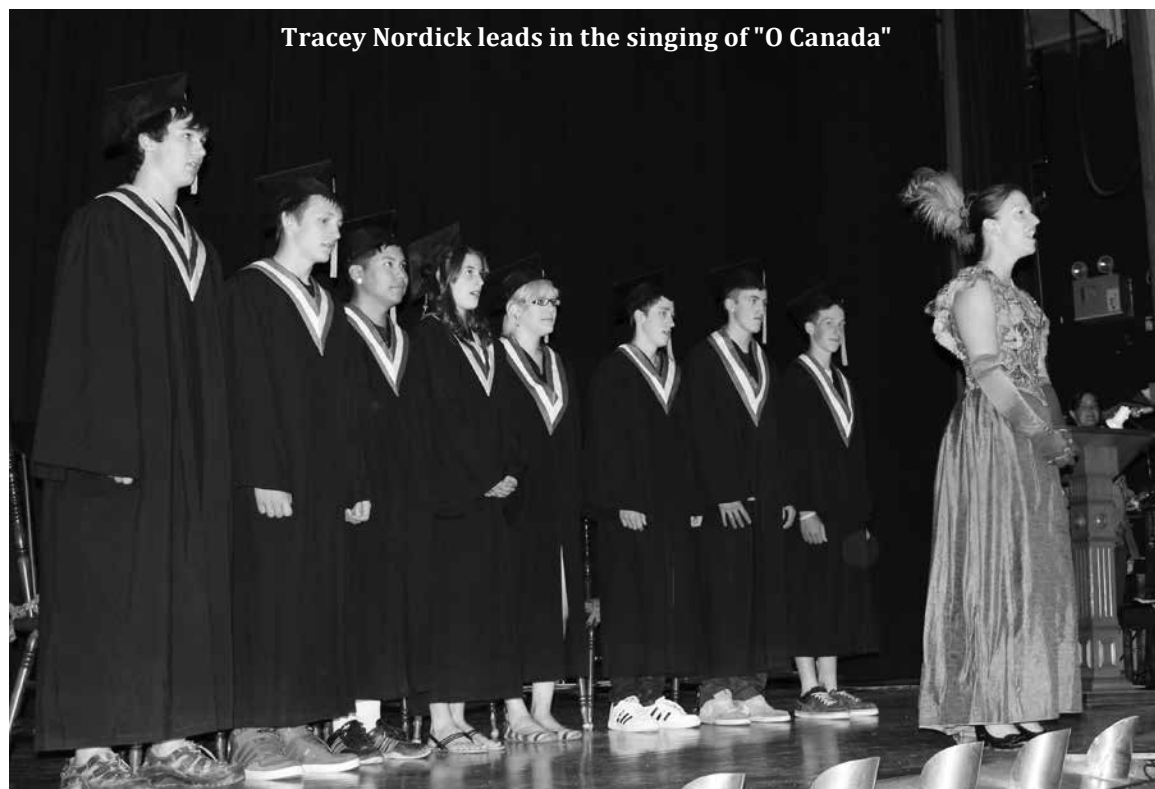

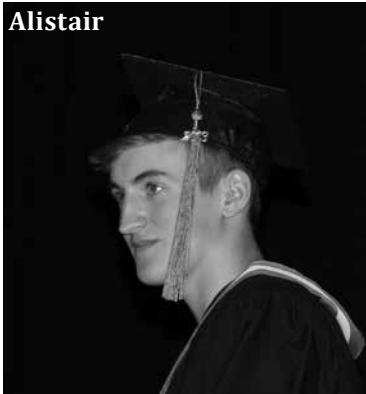

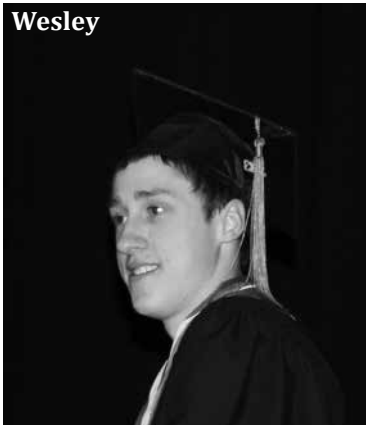

"Dawson is a special place. The staff, the principal, the community and the First Nation work together ... to provide an education for children, and I'm very proud of this school and the work that this school has done

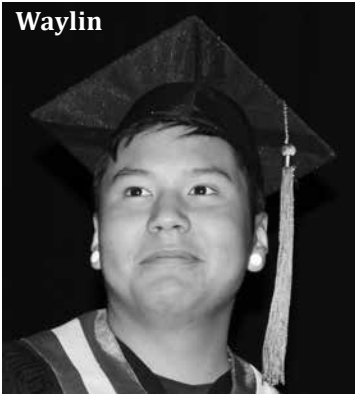

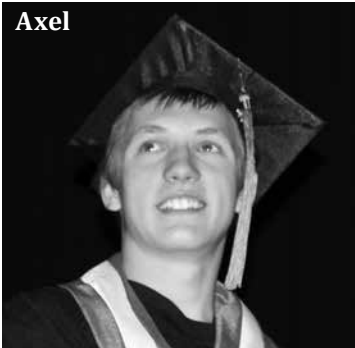

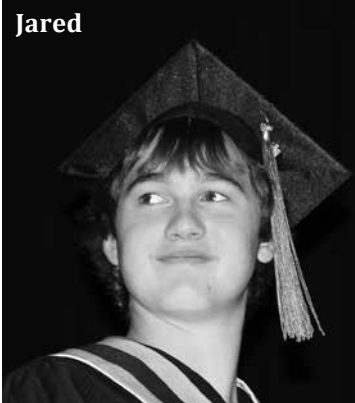

## Second summer for Hostel non-affiliation with HI

The George Black ferry is now in the water, so the Dawson City River Hostel is open for business. For its second summer, the hostel will maintain its switch from Hostelling International (HI) to Backpackers Hostels Canada.

"Herewith I want to give notice that the Dawson City River Hostel has given up on its Hostelling International (HI) affiliation," states a note from hostel owner Dieter Reinmuth on the Dawson City River Hostel website. The note cites "overbearing, arrogant and insulting inspectors" and "one-sided contract which, had I signed it, would have given control - to a large extent - to a faceless Ottawa/Vancouver bureaucracy" as its reasons for leaving the association.

When asked to elaborate, Reinmuth reiterated his issues with the bureaucracy, explaining it as a "big, inverted triangle" with the hostels at the bottom. "But this is just my opinion," he added.

HI is a worldwide organization, with about 60 hostels participating in its Canadian arm. Each province, except Manitoba, hosts at least one hostel affiliated with HI. There are currently no participating hostels

in the territories. Independent hostels must meet standards set out by the organization on their website, in order to qualify for participation. In exchange, the hostels are listed on their website and included in all marketing efforts on the part of HI.

When asked to comment on the event, Robb Cryder, Chief Operating Officer for HI Canada-Pacific Mountain Region, said in an email: "I would not want to speculate on why a hostel would choose to leave the HI-C network. I will emphasize that we have had mutually beneficial relationships spanning many years with the majority of our affiliate properties."

"We look forward to the day when the HI brand is once again featured in the Yukon."

In addition to providing cabins and tent spaces for those just passing through, the Dawson City River Hostel is home to many workers each year who choose to tent over the summer. The hostel began its affiliation with HI in 1992, according to its website. It terminated the association two summers ago. The hostel is now affiliated with Backpackers Hostels Canada, a uniquely Canadian group of over 170 hostels across the country, including three in the Yukon.

## Officials declare spring flood season over

The spring flood season in the Yukon is ending, government officials said this morning (June 5/13).

Water levels are receding, residents of Rock Creek are returning home and officials do not anticipate further problems given the weather forecast over the next four and five days.

"We are on the mend," Richard Cherepak, an emergency planner with the Emergency Measures Organization, told a media briefing this morning.

"In the last five days, we have some good weather and the water levels have receded.... Levels are almost back to flood stage."

Chris Balzer of the Department of Health and Social Services said 39 Rock Creek residents registered with the emergency social services offices in Dawson as a result of the recent flooding.

Of those, 15 required assistance with food and lodging for three days, and 10 more needed help for one or two days, he said.

Spokesman Doug Caldwell of the Yukon Housing Corp. said the corporation will send a damage assessment team to Rock Creek and Ross River to examine the extent of damage to homes and property.

The assessment will be provided to the territorial cabinet. It will be up to the government to decide what, if any, financial assistance will

be provided, he said.

Yukon hydrologist Ric Janowicz said he's never seen the water so high at Dawson City because of the spring melt. Ice jams have caused higher water, but he's not seen the melt raise the water this much, he said.

Janowicz said the river level was still 3.1 metres below the top of the dike, and it began dropping at 2 a.m. today.

There are reports, however, of rising ground water levels causing issues for basements and crawl spaces in low-lying

weather.

Another low pressure system is expected to move northward from B.C. into the Watson Lake area with some localized showers this weekend, though it won't be anything significant, he said.

Residents of Rock Creek flooded twice this year; the first time last month because of an ice jam on the Klondike River right in front of the community, and this time around because of the spring melt.

An ice jam on the Pelly

properties in the community, he said.

Janowicz said a cold winter, a snowpack which was well above average in some areas and a late spring have caused flooding this year that he hasn't seen in his many years working in the Yukon.

There were five floods earlier because of ice jams, and now there are issues because of the spring melt that was delayed by three weeks in some areas /because of cooler-than-normal temperatures, he explained.

Janowicz said with an above-average snowpack in the Southern Lakes region, he expects to see high water this summer, but not high enough to cause flooding.

But a significant amount of rainfall could change that, he said.

Meteorologist Mike Smith of Wildland Fire Management said a low pressure system dropped some rain and snow at higher levels in the Dawson area Tuesday, though the forecast over the next few days is for relatively uneventful

River at the Ross River ferry crossing caused flooding in the low levels around the community in mid-May, but nothing major.

The low-lying areas closest to the river began flooding again last week because of the spring melt, affecting a handful of properties, including a bed and breakfast business.

And the spring melt has caused the Liard River to breach the banks at Upper Liard.

The low-lying area most affected was vacated last year when the Yukon and federal governments bought out 11 properties following a disastrous flood.

The level of the Liard River at Upper Liard peaked 62 centimetres above the flood stage on Monday, and had receded 21 centimetres as of this morning.

The level of the Pelly River at Ross River peaked last Saturday at 53 centimetres above flood stage, and has since receded 50 centimetres.

## Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Celebrate the Umbrella Final Agreement

"We are gathered here today to celebrate the greatest achievement of mankind in the history of the Yukon Territory," said emcee Tim Gerberding, the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in's Director of Implementation for the First Nation's Final Agreement.



The gathering in the Dänojà Zho Cultural Cent had been called to celebrate the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing on the Umbrella Final Agreement (UFA), the document that is embedded in every one of the eleven Final Agreements that have been reached between the First Nations, the Yukon Territory and Canada.

"Yukon is a trailblazer in the realm of land claims negotiations and Self-Government, not only in Canada, but also around the world," Gerberding said.

The process grew out of a presentation made to the Canadian government by representatives of the Yukon Native Brotherhood in 1973. *Together Today for Our Children Tomorrow: A Statement of Grievances and an Approach to Settlement by the Yukon Indian People* convinced Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau to encourage the beginnings of the negotiations that led to the UFA two decades later.

"This document," said TH Councillor Debbie Nagano, "set the terms for negotiations between the First Nations, Canada and the Yukon, which resulted in our unique self-governing system and a fresh start for First Nations.

"Nurturing a government has



not been without its challenges. There are still many hurdles to overcome before we've realized the vision laid out for us by our elders. But we are on a road of our own making – a road paved by people like Elijah Smith, Percy Henry and elders from other communities. And while we're focussed on the work we still have to do, today is our chance to reflect on the great work that has already been done.

"On behalf of TH Chief and Council, I'd like to thank you for being here to recognize the signing of the Umbrella Final Agreement. And I'd also like to thank everyone who has supported our efforts towards a thriving self-government. We appreciate you being along for the journey. Mähsi."

The assembly was treated to a newly created video presentation a fact moving four and a half minute production called *Mapping the Way: Yukon First Nation Self-Government*. This can be viewed by anyone at the new website [www.mappingtheway.ca](http://www.mappingtheway.ca) along with links to a wide variety of information on the subject of Land Claims and Self-government. The video and the website are the work of the Landclaims Implementation Group to increase the general awareness of the UFA and the Land Claims process.

Gerberding noted that this year was also the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the TH Final Agreement as well as the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of final and self-government agreements signed by the Nacho Nyak Dun in Mayo.

He also said that Land Claims ought not to be seen as something bringing benefits to First Nations. The Land Claims process legitimizes the activities of everyone in the territory.

Directly in Dawson, the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in have grown from having 15 full time employees to having 70 through the year and more in the summer, making TH one of the major employers in the community.

The meeting concluded with snacks in the foyer of the cultural centre.

In the coming days, Chief Eddie Taylor will be preparing a letter to the future, describing the state of things as they are now, to be placed in a time capsule and opened 100 years from now.

## The Territory is on a Pathway to Prosperity, says Premier Pasloski

Darrell Pasloski charmed the audience in the Palace Grand immediately with his announcement that he had turned down a trip to Kiruna,



Sweden, in order to be at the Gold Show last month.

"I did have the opportunity to participate in Canada assuming the chair of the Arctic Council. I turned (that) down to be here for the Gold Show, so that tells you how important the Gold Show is to me."

Instant applause.

Indeed, the Premier brought an impressive complement of cabinet ministers with him, including Deputy Premier Elaine Taylor and Ministers Brad Cathers, Currie Dixon and Mike Nixon.

"Again this year this is an opportunity to really celebrate Dawson City, highlight the

importance of Dawson and the mining industry here to the territory.

"We all know that the Gold Show is certainly about more than gold mining. It's an opportunity to get together, to share ideas, to talk about innovation, and really to renew friendships as well.

"Over the past two mornings there's been the opportunity to hear some really excellent presentations that encompassed various types of economic development and diversity here in the Yukon; from moving oil through the territory to Alaska, to new access technologies that advance environmental stewardship here in the Yukon.

"We've heard how institutions, like the new research centre at Yukon College, are helping to advance the interests of the industry by assisting in water quality technology and assessing the effects of melting permafrost.

It's clear that there are exciting times ahead when it comes to mining in the Yukon."

The premier allowed that the decline in the price of gold over the last few months is a concern, but he felt that there are still reasons to be optimistic.

He noted that the territory has been named as the eighth top mining jurisdiction in the world last year.

"I strongly believe that Yukon's potential is not lost on investors. Investors have brought mines such as Minto, Bellekeno and Wolverine into production and helped to raise hundreds of millions of dollars into this economy. Investors have helped the professional and technical sectors, environmental and engineering consulting companies, and other service sectors grow and expand here and throughout the territory."

Over the last several years the mining, oil and gas and exploration sectors have moved from being 9% of the territory's GDP in 2007 to

being 26% now.

Three peak years of exploration leading to over \$500 million in mineral production are, he said, reasons to be optimistic.

Mining, he said, brings not only jobs, but also community development, to the territory's towns, and for this reason his government is committed to supporting the industry.

The Centre for Innovation in Mining Training was, he said, just one example of how the Yukon, in partnership with the other northern territories, was seeking to access federal assistance in educating and training a work force.

The government, he said, is looking for solutions to expand teleconnectivity and energy production throughout the territory.

"Planned economic development, creating an environment that supports business is, and will remain, the cornerstone of this government's policies. We believe that what is good for business is good for Yukon and that the prosperity the mining industry has helped to bring to our territory is really proof of that."

Trips to other countries – China, Korea, and Japan – are part of a strategy to enhance the territory's reputation Outside and abroad.

"These efforts have resulted in significant interest and foreign investment in Yukon's economy and industry."

The Premier's next junket will take him to Europe with visits to Frankfurt, Hanover, Berlin and London.

"One of the focusses of this trip will be to build on mineral sector efforts to establish partnerships within Europe

by profiling investment opportunities within Yukon's mining industry.

The delegations will also include business leaders from Yukon's tourism sector and provide opportunities for Yukon second leading industry to meet tourism operators in those countries at key events.

"This government believes that in the Yukon we can do both. We can have a strong and growing tourism industry like we've seen over the last ten years and we can have a strong and growing mineral exploration industry. That's how we're going to continue to move forward."

Pasloski indicated that the government is interested in improving and streamlining regulations and procedures related to the mining sector, including a review of the YESAB process, to provide certainty and transparency for everyone.

"We are fully aware that industry just wants to know what the rules are, and this government is committed to providing clarity."

The premier said that a decade of Yukon Party government, in combination with a decade since devolution, has brought the territory out of decline into a position of growth and strength.

"I commit to you that the investments of time, money and energy into education, infrastructure development, and legislative renewal will continue so that ... this Yukon can continue to be an attractive place to live, an attractive place to play and an attractive place to invest."

This, he concluded, will keep the territory on a "pathway to prosperity."

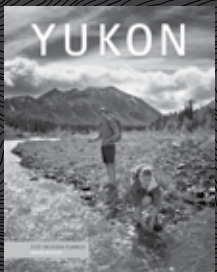

# The last supper

By 6: 05 p.m., the lineup was already snaking past the desert table in St. Mary's church at the last transient workers' supper on May 28.

Roughly 52 people showed up for the last supper of the year—unusual for the week that, most years, hits around 100, says Betty Davidson. "But we think many have taken mining jobs this year. So there were lots of people coming at the start [of the summer] when they couldn't get into the camps, and less when they left."

The transient worker's suppers started over 20 years ago. They're put on by four churches in town—St. Paul's Anglican, St. Mary's Catholic (where the suppers are hosted), Dawson Fellowship, and Dawson Community Chapel—who each shoulder responsibility for one week, coming together at the end for the final supper. The aim of these suppers is for community members to "be a buffer for [summer workers] until they can get on their feet," says Davidson.

"Basically, we became aware that young people coming up

quite often... didn't get paid until the end of May, so we knew that they were needing food and a place to visit with other young people." With many summer workers holding down two or three jobs at once, the suppers provide a welcoming space to unwind and get a sense of the community beyond the workplace.

In addition to providing food and company, the suppers also aim to be informative. Each year, community member Byron Shandler invites representatives from different organizations in the community to come speak at the worker's supper. This year, talks included a visit from the women's shelter, the Dawson City Music Festival, KVA, and the nurses' station, among others. These talks aim to inform workers on issues that, with most coming from out of province, they would be otherwise unaware.

Davidson cited one incident several summers ago as an example. "One girl was attacked by a bear, and had to be lifted out with no insurance," she says. Serious medical emergencies often have to be dealt with in a larger medical centre such

as Whitehorse and even Vancouver. This means a medical evacuation, which is not covered by provincial insurance—a costly endeavor for those who, like many summer workers, are not covered. This is the sort of situation that the community aims to avoid by hosting speakers at the suppers.

The information reaches many ears. Previous suppers this year saw about 60 workers coming to eat, a jump from only 8 at the very first supper of the season. With many mouths to feed, the General Store donates buns to each supper, The Pioneer Women assist, and the Thrift Store puts \$200 toward the cost of juice, tea and coffee, and other supplies, says Davidson. The rest—including the food itself, and the labour—is donated by members of the church community.

The suppers are one way Dawson City expresses its hospitality for those coming through in the summer months.

"It's a way to welcome people to the community," says Davidson. "Everybody here is really happy to have people come up."

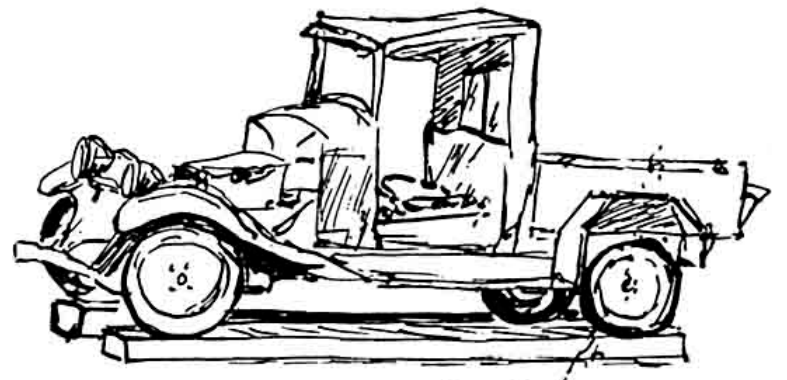
Their names were good Scottish names. There was Eric, Stuart, Les, Alan, and Derek. They actually named their band by throwing a dart at a map of America.

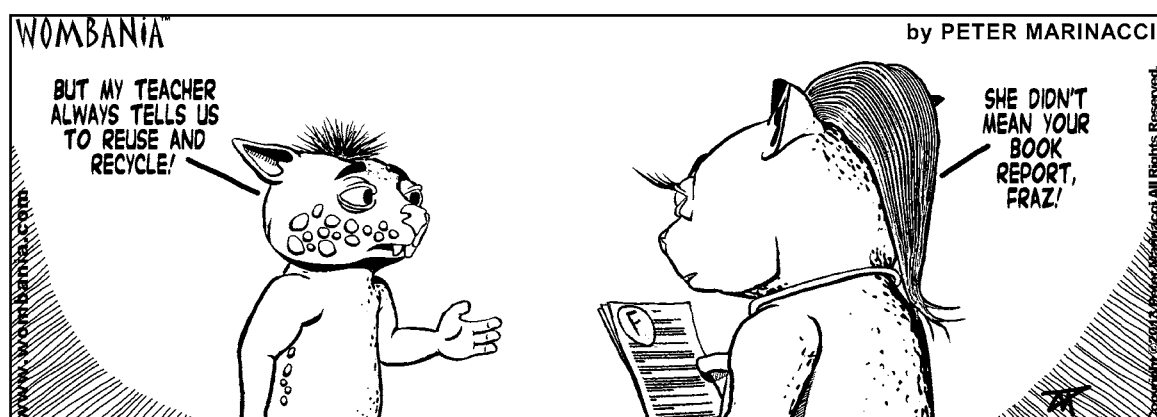

### Obsession leads to tragedy in the Nahanni River country

#### *The Whisper of Legends*

Hannah Green picked the worst possible time to go traipsing off into the wilds of the Northwest Territories with her boyfriend and a couple of his friends. Well, it may not have been a bad time for her, but for her father it was terrible. When the foursome fail to check in regularly Inspector Michael Green begins to get worried,

Green's relationship with Hannah, who is the child of his first, failed, marriage, is rocky, and he and his current wife are expecting their second child, but they both agree that he needs to go out to Nahanni and find out what has happened. Ex-wife Ashley, who Hannah lives with in Vancouver, concurs, loudly.

For city boy Green a rescue operation that turns into an extended canoe trip and mountain hike is more than a slight challenge. Fortunately he has one of his regular officers on the Toronto Police force, Brian Sullivan, who has bush experience, able to go with him. Also fortunately, as the case gets murky, he has a couple honeymooning on PEI that he can press into doing research on the members of the Hannah's crew.

We know from chapter one that Hannah has suffered a concussion early in their trip, and that none of the three guys really seem to be taking that seriously. We also suspect, quite early on, that boyfriend Scott has more on his mind than a simple wilderness excursion.

When the quartet does drop off the map they are also lucky that Constable Chris Tymco, a flying Mountie based in Fort Simpson, takes an interest in their fate when a turquoise

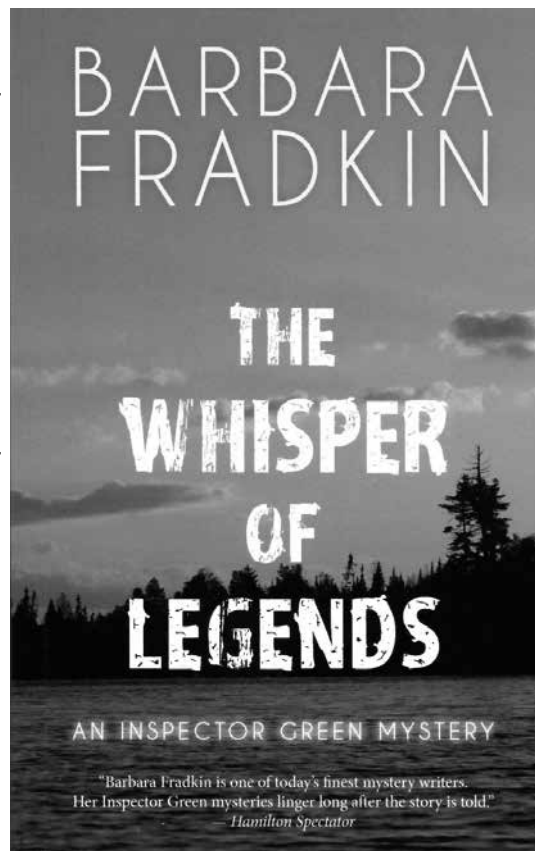
canoe is found abandoned on the river.

The lure of potential mining property does weird things to peoples' minds. Just how weird and just how many people, are two of the things we discover as this case progresses, but the inclusion of a series of letters written in the 1940s between a trapper/pro prospector husband and his wife waiting for him in Whitehorse, soon clue us in that this is an intergenerational matter going back more than 60 years.

We only follow Hannah and company for about six pages right at the beginning of the book. After that we follow Green, Tymco and the newlywed Peters during the roughly three weeks it takes for the various searches to run their course. Green and Sullivan are on site, of course. Tymco is back and forth to Whitehorse, pursuing leads that point to this all having historic roots in the Yukon. The Peters are busy on the interweb and telephones, but also find some connections in the Maritimes.

Green is a struggling canoeist, out of his depth in the mountains, and badly worried as the evidence piles up that something bad may be happening to his daughter. He is not at his best for much of the book. When one of her crew turns up dead at the bottom of a cliff, he begins to panic, but at the same time his investigator's instincts kick into gear, grounding his actions and making him increasingly useful as events move toward a confrontation. Even his Dené guide, who has done most of the tracking up to a point, tells him "You read the signs just like me. Just different signs."

There is a sense in which the death is useful, in that it galvanizes the detachment in Fort Simpson, where the Sergeant has been dragging his feet, into authorizing action



that has been grudging and intermittent up to that point.

I'm not familiar with the Nahanni area other than having read R.M. Patterson's *Dangerous River: Adventure on the Nahanni* many years ago, and Pierre Berton's account of his reporter's trips there in *My Times* and *The Mysterious North*. Berton's career took him there in search of another kind of obsession and I half-thought that's where this book was going to go when I started it, but Fradkin found a more current obsession to mine for a story.

She credits Neil Hartling's published work on the region with giving her a lot of the feel and facts that she needed to write about an area that she had never seen, and Hartling is the model for the outfitter, Ian Elliot, who assists Green during his foray into the wilderness.

Fradkin and her mystery writer buddy, Vicki Delany, are currently on their way to the Yukon via Yellowknife and will be speaking and reading at several places in Whitehorse between June 5 and 14, with side trips to Skagway, Haines Junction, Pelly Crossing and Dawson.

Delany's last Klondike mystery, *Gold Mountain*, was reviewed here recently.

I interviewed them by Skype while they were in Yellowknife and will have that for you in these pages later on.

### Great Leaders: Joseph Boulogne Le Chevalier de Saint-Georges

Saint-George was born on Christmas Day 1745. He was born of a minor aristocrat and his Negro mistress.

Being born in Guadalupe, he was unable, due to his Mulatto status, to own any land and his prospects were bleak. His father, Georges Boulogne de Saint-George, then made a daring decision and decided to introduce his son to the Parisian aristocracy. This was a daring move because France still considered the Blacks as slaves and workers, little more than mere animals.

One of the ways in which to rise in French Society was to become a renowned fencer. At 13, St. Georges picked up a sword and the beginning of a legend became into being. By the time he was 15 his speed became apparent, by 17 his speed, agility, and confidence had grown to wonderful heights.

After his fencing, which he always kept up in top form, St. George turned to the violin. Some have said it is as if the talent from his sword transphered to the bow. He devoted himself completely.

St. George took everything he could from the violin. Strengthening its limits allowing it to 'fight' with the orchestra. The Concertos were born.

One of St. George's greatest regrets was his inability to wed. Although he was a lover of many, he could not find a love. That is until he met Marie Joseph, she became his one great love. A child was born from their union but it was left to die of neglect and Georges never saw Marie again.

St. George was to turn in his fencing and his bow and become a leader of over 1,000 black soldiers during the reform movement that promised abolition. Unfortunately the reform led to rebellion. The king was forced to abdicate. Then as the Guillotine grew thirsty the King was beheaded and members of the upper classes went as well.

St. George was imprisoned in 1793 and spent his time hearing his friends and associates being beheaded. Georges was in prison for 18 months, having lost the aristocratic life he was used to he spent his last few years playing with small orchestras and he died in 1799 at only 54 years of age.

His music is now being rediscovered though it is feared that only a third of his works survived the Revolution. St Georges de Chevalier deserves a place in history as a Great Leader of himself.

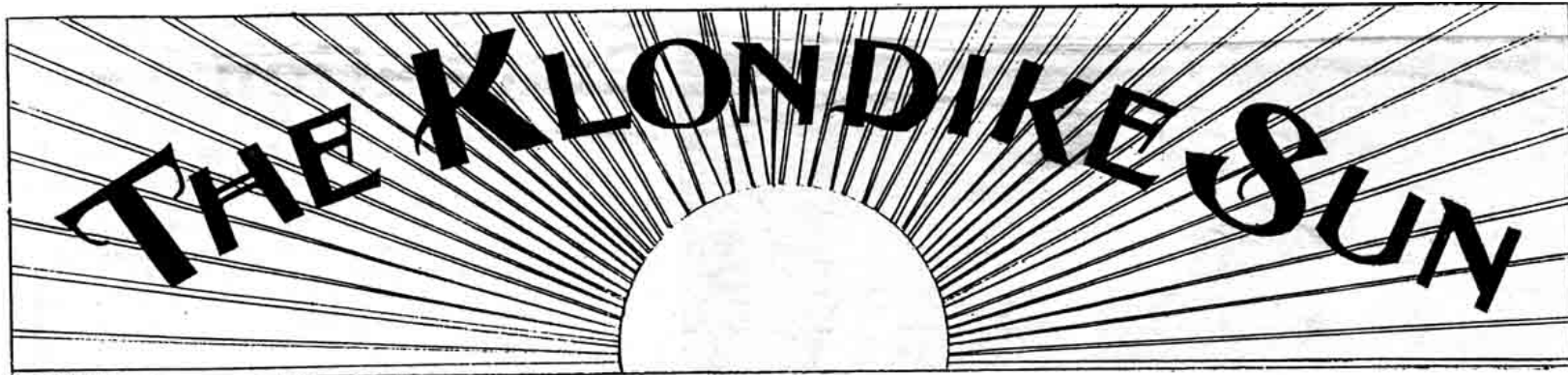

## Bank to return city's money

The City of Dawson will be getting its money back from the CIBC.

The city had originally agreed to advance \$15,000 in seed money to the CIBC in order to encourage the bank to put in a banking machine, something the city has been arguing in favour of for many years.

Having decided two weeks ago that the City should take "another kick" at trying to get its seed money for the banking machine back from the CIBC, city councillors were pleased to hear, on June 3, that this would probably be the case. This

was reported by a happy Mayor Peter Jenkins, who expanded on his statement in a later interview.

"The bank is all happy and there's a letter forthcoming from them agreeing to all the terms and conditions," Jenkins said.

The Klondike Visitors Association invested \$5,000, leaving the bank to come up with the rest of the bill, estimated at \$40,000 plus installation costs. The machine officially opened on May 3, and has done well, according to CIBC District Manager Dave Waterman.

According to Waterman, the

## Members of the Aboriginal Leadership Opportunity Year group were Intrigued by Dawson

Members of the Aboriginal Leadership Opportunity Year (ALOY) group were in Dawson between May 2 and 7 as part of their cross Canada tour of duty.

The ALOY program was created in August 2008 to provide a military education and learning experience for members of aboriginal communities in Canada. ALOY is one of several programs created to demonstrate to aboriginal communities in rural, urban

and remote locations that the Canadian Forces offers a fair and equitable environment in which to serve.

The ALOY program strives to provide aboriginal cadets with the opportunity to excel in the four cornerstones that are at the core of life at Kingston's Royal Military College of Canada - Leadership, Academics, Military Training, and Athletics.

Sgt Robert Taillon and Warrant Officer Cote, who are travelling with the group, are quick to point out that the aim of the program is not recruitment for the Canadian military, though it can lead to that, or to the RCMP.

Cadets in this group hail from First Nation groups right across the country.

Elder Bernard Nelson, from a First Nation north of Thunder Bay, is along with the group to provide traditional knowledge and counseling.

Edmonton's Wyatt Bird hadn't travelled much before joining the ALOY program.

At 21, Bird is one of the older cadets in this cadre. After high school he studied police and security at college and decided he'd like to try out the Canadian

Forces.

"I wanted to give it a chance, without making a big commitment, to see if it was for me. To be honest, I joined the program, fell in love with it and I'm planning to enter into the regular officer training plan program next year."

On this tour they have attended a number of pow-wows in north Ontario, to Six Nations, and Ottawa before

coming to the Yukon.

Here they spent time with the local Ranger patrol, learning how to handle the Enfield rifles and 12 gauge shotguns used locally, doing some practical shooting at the Swede Creek range, getting familiar with Ranger bush equipment, building improvised brush shelters ("hootchies") and doing survival drills (fire starting, travelling guidelines,

etc). There was to have been a hunting trip, but the weather wasn't good enough to allow that.

Sightseeing tours included the Dome, the Gold Fields and Dredge No. 4, and the banquet was at the Triple J.

Ranger Sergeant John Mitchell says that there is a strong possibility that next year's ALOY group may come here as well.

## Lost Films have found their way to the Museum

Among the new programming at the Dawson City Museum this summer will be the opportunity to see three "reels" (well, DVDs really) compiled from the 500 reels of nitrate film discovered in 1978 when shovel operator Tommy Taylor was excavating for what was then going to become the new skating rink.

Preserved in the permafrost, these reels consisted of rare silent newsreels, shorts and features that were shown in Dawson City between 1903 and 1929. Dawson was the end of the road for the film distribution business in those days, and the distributors didn't want the prints back, so they were first stored in the basement of the Carnegie Library (now the Masonic Lodge), and then used as part of the landfill in a project across the street. There, they were preserved by the permafrost.

Since this type of film is so flammable and unstable, many of these items were one-of-a-kind, and so dangerous to transport that the crew at Parks Canada, led by Michael Gates, eventually had to have them flown to Ottawa by military transport plane.

You can read Michael's account of this adventure in his book *History Hunting in the Yukon*.

Some of them were duplicated and were shown in Dawson during the 2004 International Short Film Festival, but having them on site permanently hasn't been possible.

With generous help from Yukon Energy, the Museum has digitized these cinematic time capsules, and dressed them up with music from Dawson's own Barnacle Bob (who also played at the showing in 2004).

This window into the past, as Museum Director Laura Mann likes to call it, was on display for the first time on the evening of May 22.

There was a full house in the museum's theatre room, with hors d'oeuvres snacks, wine and popcorn between reels.

Each of the three reels contains a sampling of newsreel coverage, some serious stuff and some not so serious, as well as maddeningly incomplete snippets from movies of that era.

"For Yukon Energy, this is an extremely worthwhile cause," said Janet Patterson on the company's blog, "and one that fits with our values. Whether it's saving old film footage or saving electricity, it's all about valuing what we have and using it wisely."

Yukon Energy was promoting other types of saving at the event. Clotheslines with messages about the value of hanging out ones laundry were strung through the gift shop, and the company handed out packages of clothespins and credit vouchers for clotheslines at the event.

## Tourism Minister Nixon Anticipates a Strong Tourist Season

As one of the pillars of the Dawson economy is the tourism industry, it was certainly not out of place to have the Minister of Tourism, Mike Nixon, speak during the recent Gold Show weekend.

Nixon brought a good news message to the room.

"Tourism is having a real



impact on the lives of Yukoners, as many of you know, and it's providing tremendous business opportunities ... across the territory. Yukon is attracting a growing number of visitors from around the world, and the industry in our territory is very strong."

Nixon said that the industry generates about \$200 million annually and that over 25% of all Yukon businesses participate in the industry to some degree, with more than four percent of the territory's GDP being derived from tourism.

Surveys have shown that 2012 was an especially rich year for the industry. Visitation was up by four percent, with these increases being led by people close to home, in both Canada and the USA.

"Air arrivals and departures as well as visitation by motor coach were up a staggering 10% over the previous year," the minister said, though he conceded that some of the airport figures might be inflated by mine workers coming and going.

What is undisputed, however, is that visitation to the territory has increased by 25% since 2004.

"That's an impressive three percent growth per year. This means that Yukon received 63,000 more visitors in 2012 compared to the same period in 2004."

Also, visitor spending was up 29% in the same time period, with a total of \$112 million spent by visitors last summer alone.

To accumulate more accurate statistics, the Dept. of Tourism has been working on a two year tracking program, the first phase of which will include details about travel to the Klondike region in particular.

So far, the program has

confirmed what has been generally thought to be the case, that both wildlife viewing and the Klondike's history rank as important experiences that visitors expect to have when travelling in the Yukon.

"Equally important is the quality of experience had by our visitors, for both wildlife viewing and experiencing the Klondike Gold Rush. Visitors had an amazing 73% satisfaction rating.

"For the Klondike this high satisfaction rating truly speaks to the unique high quality of the visitor experience. The Government of Yukon recognizes and continues to promote Dawson and the Klondike as an iconic Yukon experience. We do that in all of our global marketing materials, campaigns and media relations."

Tourism related businesses here are supported by the Tourism Marketing Fund, to the tune of over \$72,000 in 2011 and more than \$90,00 in 2012.

Nixon spoke of his department's efforts to ameliorate the impact of the Parks Canada cuts in the Yukon and Dawson which were part of Canada's Economic Action Plan 2012.

"There were months and month of discussions and meetings with the federal government and work with our MP, Ryan Leef. Earlier this year I was pleased to join our MP to announce opportunities for the private sector to provide guided tours to the SS Klondike and Dredge

No. 4. It's very exciting to see these partnerships seizing the tourism opportunities provided by Klondike's mining history."

Nixon said that discussions related to dealing with the Parks Canada cuts were ongoing and that his department was aware of the need to monitor and preserve the Klondike's collection of more than 250,000 artifacts in the light of those cuts.

He also spoke of the long-standing collaboration between his department and placer miners in finding and securing fossil remains of various Beringian creatures over the decades.

"Over 3,000 fossils from the Klondike were acquired by the Yukon Paleontology Program just last summer alone."

Nixon announced an archeological study program that his department is carrying out in the Dawson-Mayo mining districts with the cooperation of the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in and the Nacho Nyak Dun.

"This program will identify and inventory archeological and heritage resources that may be found on land affected by mining activities. Archeological sites in Yukon contain some of the earliest evidence of human occupation in the New World."

Nixon concluded by stressing the importance he places on the collaborating with locals in Dawson, including the miners, the business community, the Klondike Visitors Association and the local municipality.

## Acclaimed Crime-Writing Duo To Speak at the Museum

says Delany, who hopes to continue her research of the period during the tour. "It's that thrill of the unknown and the courage to face it that I've tried to capture in my books along with a strong sense of fun, and sometimes the ridiculous." *Gold Web*, the fourth installment in the series, is due out in December. The third book, *Gold Mountain*, was reviewed here last issue.

Over the course of their tour, Delany and Fradkin will discuss their recent publications and detail the inspiration and research behind them. Notable tour stops include the NorthWords Writers Festival in Yellowknife, the Klondike Gold Rush National Historic Park in Skagway, and the Dawson City Museum in Dawson on June 13.



# RSS Valedictorians' Speech 2013: A Double Header from the Grade 12 Class

A person is defined by the community they belong to, so when somebody asks in the future, "Where are you from?" be proud to say: Dawson City, Yukon.

JS: As much as we have come to love Dawson, the thought of moving on is exciting. The other day, I rode the bus into town for the last time, and then took my last walk through the halls of RSS as a student. It seems to me that lately, we've all been having a lot of "last times". I can't wait until these "last times" end, and we start to experience some "first times". RSS has been our whole world for these last 13 years, and I have to say, it's going to be different moving to a place where nobody knows my mother.

AH: Ever since Kindergarten, when our teacher pointed out the Graduating class of that year, we have been striving to achieve this goal: graduation. A few days ago, one of our classmates said: we're graduating...yeahahha... now what? Now, we have reached a decisive moment. We have to think hard about the future and not just about the next assignment, birthday, or volleyball tournament. We have to make decisions about what we are going to do next, whether it's working and saving money, bounding halfway across the world, or furthering our education. Axel is an all-around good guy, for example, after breaking his leg, he faithfully showed up to volleyball practices, cast and all, and helped coach. Axel is a good friend, and we're lucky to have him. What Axel has taught us, is that if you swim about as good as a rock, it's good to have a lifeguard for a girlfriend.

AH: Waylin Nagano. Waylin has *always* been here at Robert Service, and it's hard to picture the school without him. Waylin is easy to get along with, the first to laugh, and he seems to be related to, or friends with, everyone in this town. Waylin is a key player on the hockey team, as well as the volleyball team, playing goalie, and setter. Waylin brings enthusiasm and humour to the school and we have learned from him that, if you hug teachers, and tell them they look good, they'll give you whatever you want.

## Italian Adventurer/Blogger Plans a Yukon River Anniversary

Igor D'India is fascinated by adventure and wants to tell the story of Walter Bonatti, an Italian mountaineer, adventurer and reporter who made a solo trip some years ago down the Yukon River from Whitehorse to Dawson and on to Fort Yukon. Then he flew to Old Crow and returned again to Fort Yukon by river. This was in 1965, so D'India wants to make the trip himself in 2014 as 50th anniversary homage.

To get ready, he came to the Yukon this year to scout the journey and watch the river break up in Dawson.

To get here, he hit the road in Toronto where he has been working for the last year, and stuck out his thumb.

"It took me six days, more or less," he said when we met over coffee at Riverwest. "I was very lucky with rides. I never waited more than 6 hours."

Bonatti is his hero. He was a top climber for 17 years, scaling most of the world's highest and most difficult peaks and then, in 1965, after a tough solo climb of the Matterhorn, he announced his retirement from extreme climbing and took up a second career as an adventure reporter.

For the next 20 years he trekked through jungles, across deserts and up a few mountains in Africa, Australia, Malaya, Antarctica and South America. But, although his Wikipedia bio doesn't mention it, his first solo trek was to paddle down the Yukon River.

"There was no crew following him in an RV," said D'India. "He was by himself."

D'India plans to do it the same way.

"NO cell phones, no RV trailer, no team following along beside the river. Just me, a canoe and a camera."

Bonatti wrote up the trip for the magazine *Epoca*, and D'India says the piece got noticed in the 1960s.

"People were really impressed, because, you know, Alaska, the Yukon, Jack London, big rivers. They didn't expect to see all those pictures. There were wolves, moose, bears, so I think people were pretty good impressed."

D'India read Bonatti's book when he was 14 years old and found in that work a template for the sort of life he thought he would like to live.

He hasn't been climbing a lot of mountains, but began reporting from war torn areas in 2002. In 2005 he made a documentary about the involvement of the Russian government in a tragedy in North Ossetia, winning the Bizzarri Film Festival Special Price in 2006.

In 2009-2010 he filmed the Team Est expedition in "the worst car ever made, a small Fiat Y10, throughout Africa and Asia (the Mongol and Africa Rally).

"The film 'The Y10 Diaries' (available on YouTube) tells of their odyssey and several failures. For the Y10 diaries episode I won The Adventurists Film Festival in London in 2010."

D'India is on a shoestring

budget, without any backing at this time. Hitchhiking to the Yukon was a matter of necessity as well as an adventure for his blog.

In 2010 he walked the Oreto River (in Palermo, Sicily) to document the polluted state of its waters.

In 2011 he mounted a bicycle and retraced Garibaldi's route from Sicily to Turin to celebrate the 150th anniversary of Italian unification.

In 2012 he spent 700 hours living alone in a cave 30 metres underground, having been fascinated by the experiments of Michel Siffre, the French underground explorer, adventurer and scientist.

D'India said he has experienced great kindness during his several weeks in Dawson. He was offered the use of a motorhome to bunk in, and says that Mayor Wayne Potoroka was supportive of his plans for next summer.

"I didn't find the money this year, but next year I'll come back. I'll be working the whole year to put some money together for the flights or find a sponsor to cover me."

## 2013 TRANSPORTATION PERSON THE YEAR

John Van Every was born in 1936 in Sudbury, Ontario, the eldest son of Owen and Grace Van Every. Like his father before him, John became interested in the transportation industry at a very young age. John's mother Grace would often put three bottles of formula in his father's lunch bag and away father and son would go for the day in the truck. The summer John was 11 years old, he skidded logs with a small farm tractor for his father on a clearing contract. By the time he was 14 years of age John was working in a garage and driving a tow truck.

In the fall of 1968 John came north to drive for Cassiar Asbestos Transport Division. Upon his arrival, he knew that trucking in the North was his true calling. John's truck was one of two trucks loaded with asbestos from the mine that went through the ice bridge in the Yukon River in December of 1969.

After hauling asbestos for a few years, John became the supervisor of the Skyline in Dawson City. The Skyline was a tramline that hauled asbestos across the Yukon River during break-up and freeze-up. Before the Clinton Creek mine closed in 1978, John became employed with Klondike Transport. In 1985, John formed a company called Dawson City Backhoe Service. Dawson City Backhoe Service expanded into truck and equipment rentals. The company owned a Cessna 185 aircraft that was used for company business.

In 1986, John started his own transportation business called Van Every Inc. John's business began small but eventually grew and consisted of tire sales and service, propane sales and supplies, RV recovery, Esso products, Finning products, fuel, and, his passion – equipment hauling.

In March of 2004, John was one of the many transport drivers that took supplies into Old Crow on the winter road for the construction on the airport. The trip was a memorable one taking 24 hours to go in and 18 hours to return.

John eventually purchased a 1947 Chevy 3 ton truck which he restored and now uses in the Canada Day and Discovery Day parades in Whitehorse. John is a member of the Yukon Transportation Association and continues to be a strong advocate for the transportation industry in Yukon.

Believing that the transportation industry is an integral part of Yukon's economy, over the years John has lobbied various levels of government about its operation and welfare.

John has always given generously to auction fundraisers for the Klondike Placer Miners Association, Dawson City Museum, and various other organizations. It also gave him great pleasure to help a child by donating to the annual R.C.M.P. bike rodeo.

John is a true pioneer for his many years and miles dedicated to the transportation industry of Yukon.

## F is for...

**F** is for French Fries!

French Fries aren't really French they first appeared in North America! They are often called 'chips', or 'fries', French-fried potatoes, or even 'wedgies'! (Wedgies are big chunks of potato covered in spices, I like French Onion Soup Mix or Sage and Seasoning Salt, and then they are baked in the oven).

There is a difference between 'chips' and 'fries'. 'Chips' are more 'thickly' cut.

Fries are generally served as a side order for a burger or sandwich, or they can just be a snack. Fries are usually served salted with ketchup, vinegar, or even mayonnaise. Some fries are even made out of sweet potatoes!

French fries have been around a long time. Thomas Jefferson asked for his potatoes to be served the 'French way' in 1802. By 1856 the term French fry first appeared in print.

In Spain they are known as 'Patatas Fries'.

In the Southern Netherlands and Belgium fries are called 'Vlaamse Frieten' or 'Flemish Fritas'.

The first Fish and Chips shop appeared in 1860 in Britain starting the British fast food industry. Do you know of any town in Britain that doesn't have a Fish and Chip Shop?

Frozen fries did not appear until the 1940's and as of today take 30% of all the potatoes grown.

What is a firefly and what makes it glow?

Formica was invented in 1912 and by 1913 Formica had 18 employees. Formica has been used as an electrical insulator, gears for over 6,000 Chevy's and other motor vehicles, even airplane propellers in W.W.II but its primary use is in kitchen counters, bathrooms, and tables and chairs.

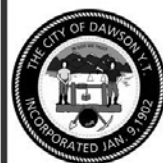
The City of Dawson is soliciting volunteers to sit on the Heritage Advisory Committee.

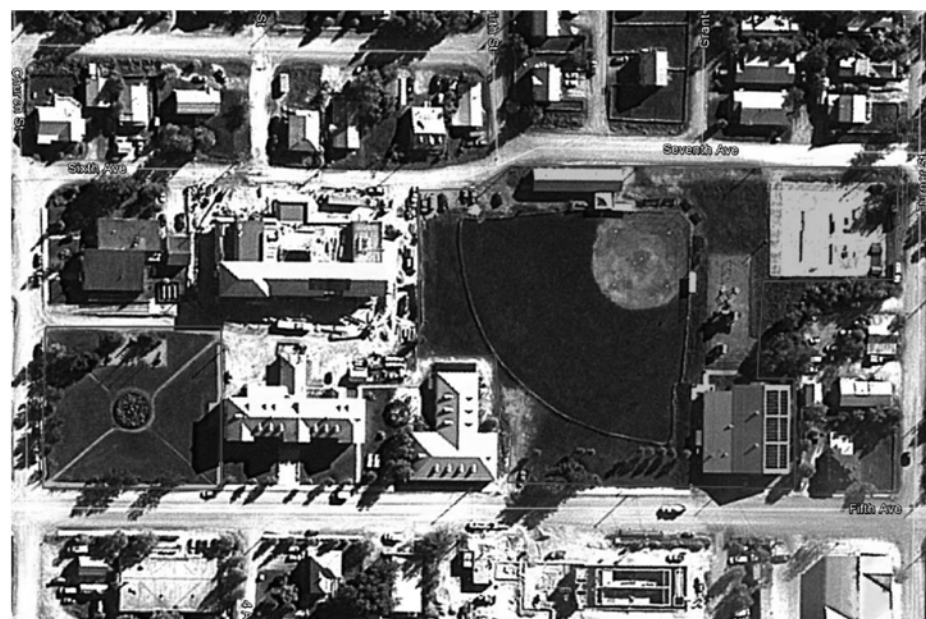
