# Commissioner celebrates the Maple Leaf Flag in Dawson City

As part of his own efforts to celebrate the 50th anniversary of Canada's Maple Leaf Flag, Commissioner Doug Phillips visited Dawson City on Tuesday, February 10, to meet with various groups in town and present large flags at each gathering.

During the day he met with students at Robert Service School, seniors at McDonald Lodge, and the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Chief and Council at the Dänojà Zho Cultural Centre.

In the evening he visited with Dawson's Town Council during its regular council meeting and was warmly welcomed by Mayor Wayne Potoroka.

"It's great to be in Dawson City again," said the Commissioner. "I try to get up here a few times each year, especially for the Tea and Ball."

These will be held this year on the Yukon's actual birthday, June 13.

"I'm partnering with Heritage Canada ... (who) had some money to help in promoting the anniversary of the Canadian Flag, which is the 15th of February. My

idea was to travel throughout the territory, visit as many Yukon schools as I could, and talk to our youth and tell them the history of the flag, how we got the flag, and tell them a little bit about how important the flag is to our freedoms and our values."

The previous week he travelled to Watson Lake and this was his week for Dawson.

"We had a great event at the school where we had Grade 12s and some Grade 3s and 4s there. The interaction with the students was amazing. Part of the program was to ask them questions and get them to respond (and ask me questions) and to give them an idea of what the flag's all about.

"It scares the living daylights out of me when I ask Grade 3s and 4s to ask me questions because you can get anything under the sun. It was an interesting day and I was pleased that many of the children were well informed. Their teachers have been talking about Canadian history and the flag. That's really great.

"I was just encouraging them to respect the flag, to understand what our flag stands for and means, and to fly the flag, not only on

February 15, but throughout the whole year."

From Dawson the Commissioner went to Old Crow and this week he will be travelling the North Alaska Highway, with Teslin scheduled the week after that.

"When I was told a few weeks ago that the flag was 50 years old," he said, "I was shocked, because I keep thinking the flag happened about ten years ago. Time passes very quickly.

"When the kids asked me what the flag means to us, I told them the flag is a symbol

of each and every one of you. It's a symbol of our country. It's respected throughout the world. (Our military has worn the maple leaf) on their shoulder patches and their patches even prior to the flag, (the idea for which) originated with a military medal back in 1921."

He said that having to put together this tour has taught him personally more than he ever knew about the flag before. He said the questions he has been asked so far have prompted him to do more research and he has more to say at each stop along the way.

Concluding his presentation to council, the Commissioner and his aide, Al Lucier, presented the members with a large flag and posed for a photo opportunity.

"Fly it proudly from your flagpole," he said.

The Dawson flag tour was arranged with the cooperation of Klondike National Historic Sites and especially Public Outreach Education Officer Marie -Eve Owen.

## Uffish Thoughts: Maple Leaf memories after 50 years

I was 13 during much of the great flag debate, and can recall quite clearly the black and white television images (most likely on CBC) on the day that the flag first flew on Parliament Hill.

My family was pretty staunchly Progressive Conservative. My grandmother's elder brother had been one of the chief local organizers for George Nolan, who held the riding for decades and later passed it on to his son, Pat, much the same way that Elmer McKay bequeathed the Pictou riding to his son Peter after loaning it to Brian Mulroney.

Knowing what I now know about the history of the Red Ensign to which they were so devoted, that the version I had seen in my classroom ever since starting school had only come into general use in 1957, for instance, it seems odd that my family was so keen on keeping it. Two uncles had seen service under a different version of that flag during WW II.

My grandfather, on the other hand, had never seen service, and I later learned that his birthdate had been

altered by his parents in order to keep him at home to work on the family farm when conscription was introduced in the Great War.

At any rate, they claimed to, and no doubt did, love that flag and were most upset with Prime Minister Pearson's attempts to change it. In fact, they were upset with the Liberal government, period, feeling that it had somehow pulled the rug out from under John Diefenbaker's Progressive Conservatives.

History indicates that Dief the Chief pretty much pulled the rug himself, but those histories hadn't been written in 1965.

So the news came on, and I suppose the Red Ensign came down the pole. I don't recall that part. I do remember the Maple Leaf going up and sort of thinking that we did, after all, sing that Maple Leaf song at school. As it went up it seemed that the breeze died away and that the new flag hung rather limply.

That would never happen at a live event today. Some member of the PMO would have arranged for a large fan to be blowing outside the frame, the way that the

models in the fashion photos my daughter in Toronto designs always seem to be windblown.

But the Maple Leaf hung there and my mother and grandparents almost cheered at the sight, commenting that it was just fitting that this should have happened, that that new rag would never last the test of time.

Well, they were wrong. It was no time at all before that flag was recognized world-wide, and may have been more admired internationally than it was at home. Certainly, sewing one on a backpack was the way many travelling Canadians gained a lot of good will around the world, and a great many Americans, whose stock kept dropping as the Viet Nam War marched on, adopted it as camouflage.

I find it odd that, after spending so much money (over \$5 million) celebrating Britain's War of 1812 three years ago, and with preparations to spend another \$4 million celebrating the life of Sir John A. Macdonald, and no one will say exactly how much to promote Canada

150, a mere \$50,000 was set aside to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of our own, very distinctive flag.

At least the government did allocate \$200,000 for events to be carried out by the Lieutenant Governors and Commissioners across the land and I'm happy to report that Commissioner Phillips did his bit in Dawson on FE. 10, both at the school and at town council.

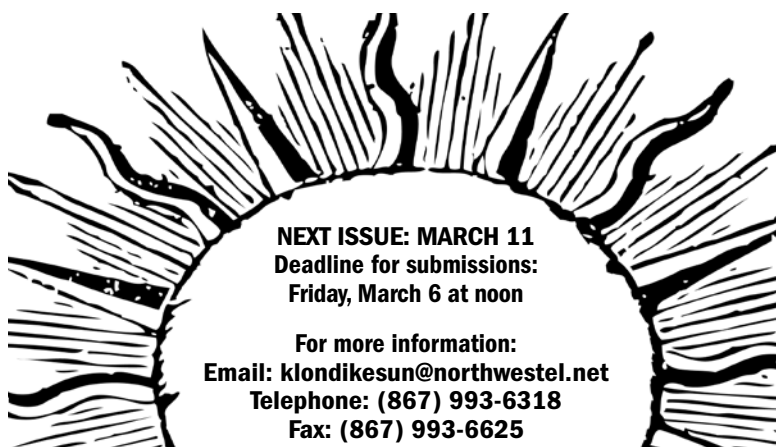
Bruce Chambers' analysis of flag related advertising over the years, run on CBC Radio on February 11, concluded that it has been diminishing over the decades, but never so much as just now.

He ended, "With so little marketing allocated to our national emblem's 50th anniversary, if we want to see a truly stirring celebration of Canada's flag, we're going to have to look back at old beer and gasoline commercials."

Back in 2012 the present government chose to pretty much ignore the 30th anniversary of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms. Like the flag, it came into being under a Liberal government, and one cannot help but wonder if that's why both got such a low profile from the Conservatives.

## Poor socio-economic conditions in Canada's territories contribute to low grades on health report card

OTTAWA, Feb. 12, 2015 / CNW/ - Canada's territories all score "D-" grades in The Conference Board of Canada's How Canada Performs: Health report card. This is the first report card to compare Canada, the 10 provinces, three territories, and 15 peer countries.

"The territories do poorly on most health indicators. However, it's important to keep in mind that socio-economic factors, such as poverty, infrastructure, cost of living, education, and housing, have a huge impact on the health of the population," said Gabriela Prada, Director, Health Innovation, Policy and Evaluation.

"In order to address the poor health outcomes in the territories, efforts must be made to improve socio-economic conditions. This will require tailored approaches that are inclusive of Aboriginal traditional knowledge, building on strengths that reinforce the sense of community."

The *How Canada Performs: Health* report card assesses performance on 11 health status indicators.

### Nunavut

Nunavut ranks last among the 29 comparator jurisdictions. It receives "D-" grades on six indicators: life expectancy, premature mortality, infant mortality, suicides, mortality due to cancer, and mortality due to respiratory diseases. Nunavut's "D" on self-reported mental health is not surprising given its high suicide rate.

On the flip side, Nunavut scores an "A+" on mortality

due to diabetes and "A"s on mortality due to nervous system diseases, and heart disease and stroke. Given the low life expectancy and high premature mortality rate in Nunavut, its "A"s on these indicators likely reflect the fact that the majority of the population does not live long enough to suffer from diseases that arise later in life. Nunavut's life expectancy at birth is only 71.8 years—almost 10 years lower than the national average of 81.5 years.

### Northwest Territories

The Northwest Territories places 28th and receives "D-" grades on four indicators: life expectancy, premature mortality, infant mortality, and mortality due to cancer. The territory also has one of the highest mortality rates due to respiratory diseases, and scores a "D" on this indicator. N.W.T. earns "C" grades on suicides and mortality due to heart disease and stroke. The territory's best performance is on self-reported health, a measure of how people feel about their own health. N.W.T. scores an "A+" on this indicator and is the top-ranked overall.

Like Nunavut, N.W.T. also earns high grades on mortality due to nervous system diseases and diabetes, earning "A"s on both indicators. As it is the case in Nunavut, the strong performance on these two indicators likely reflects the fact that deaths from these diseases typically occur later in life—and in a region like N.W.T., which has a low life expectancy and high premature mortality rate, people are dying prematurely of other diseases.

### Yukon

Yukon sits third from the bottom overall and has more balanced rankings on the health indicators than the other two territories. The territory earns fewer "A"s than N.W.T. and Nunavut, but it also earns fewer "D-"s. Similar to the other provinces and territories, Yukon receives an "A" on self-reported health, but also scores an "A" for having one of the lowest suicide rates in the country. Yukon's scores "B"s on mortality due to heart disease and stroke, mortality due to nervous system diseases, and self-reported mental health. Yukon earns a "D-" on mortality due to diabetes, with the highest mortality rate among all the comparator regions. The territory also gets "D-" grades on life expectancy and on mortality due to cancer. It

scores "C"s on two indicators: premature mortality and infant mortality.

Socio-economic status affects lifestyle choices which, in turn, affect health outcomes. The territories fare poorly on many lifestyle-related risk factors, particularly Nunavut. Obesity rates and smoking rates are well above the Canadian average in all three territories, while fruit and vegetable consumption is significantly below the Canadian average. This is partially explained by the high cost of healthy food in the territories compared with the Canadian average. Difficulties in accessing affordable fruits and vegetables places the residents of the territories at a higher risk of developing a chronic disease.

*How Canada Performs* is an ongoing research program at The Conference Board of Canada to help leaders

identify relative strengths and weaknesses in Canada's socio-economic performance. Six performance domains are assessed: Economy, Education and Skills, Innovation, Environment, Health, and Society.

Released today, and building on previous *How Canada Performs* analyses, the Health report card is the third of six to be produced on Canadian and provincial socio-economic performance. The Economy and Education and Skills report cards were published in 2014. The remaining report cards will follow over the year.

This is the first year that provincial and territorial rankings are included in the report cards. Further details, including information on data sources and the methodology behind the rankings, can be found on the *How Canada Performs* website.

# Details given of McDiarmid’s arrest and transport to Whitehorse

Constable Derek Turner was contacted by his superiors on the evening of October 20, 2011, and instructed to report for a briefing on the McDiarmid case, after which he flew to Dawson City to take charge of the suspect. He arrived about 12:45 the next morning.

Turner is a 13 year veteran with the RCMP who has been working with M Division’s Major Crimes Unit for much of that time. Among other duties, he is in charge of the evidence lock-up.

He was the second witness to testify on Thursday, February 5.

Under questioning from Crown Prosecutor Jennifer Grandy, Turner revealed that he flew to Dawson with a pair of EMS personnel, to take charge of McDiarmid and accompany him to Whitehorse General Hospital for further treatment of his gunshot wounds.

Before that, however, Turner took charge of the suspect’s

clothes, including blood soaked jeans, underwear, socks, outer winter pants, a couple of sweaters, boots, the contents of his pants’ pockets and a white T-shirt. No mention was made of his hat, which has previously been referenced as being on the road near where he fell after being shot.

These items were produced in court, contained in their labeled evidence bags. In one case the bag had been damaged and was encased in another clear plastic bag. Turner was also asked to authenticate the double bagged plastic containing the orange pill bottle which contained the mushroomed slug that had been referred in earlier testimony. The outer bag also contained several test slugs that had been fired from the guns of Constables Jeff Nielsen and David Marentette during the investigation by the Alberta Serious Incident Response Team.

Turner said he had laid out the clothes to dry in a secure

area before bagging them for transport.

He testified that he had handled certain of the evidence bags a number of times when they had been needed in court at various hearings related to this case.

On the night in question, he arrested McDiarmid in Dawson twice, first at 1:10 a.m. on a charge of attempted murder, and again, later, on some weapons related charges. At 6:30 a.m. he departed for Whitehorse with the accused and the EMS workers.

Almost immediately he flew back to Dawson and assisted in the investigation in the community, though he did not go to the Dempster scene.

In his cross examination McDiarmid questioned why it had been left to Turner to arrest him and why it had not been done out on the highway. He wondered why a potential weapon, such as a piece of a socket wrench, had been left in the pockets of his snow pants,



from which it, and some coins, were later retrieved.

Turner offered that he could not say why things had transpired as they had, since he was not there at that time. He might, he conceded, have done things differently, but did do what he was sent to do when he arrived.

McDiarmid questioned Tuner closely about the security of the evidence locker in Whitehorse, wanting to know who had keys and whether it would have

been possible for someone (not Turner, he said) to get into that locker and tamper with the evidence.

Turner replied that there were two sets of keys, of which he had one, to a very secure, heavy-duty lock, and that, further, the locker itself was in a securely locked room. While McDiarmid insisted there was a possibility that the scenario he was suggesting might have taken place, Turner thought it most unlikely.

## McDiarmid Jury hears an account of some evidence from the scene of the shooting

These days Constable Kelly Manweiller works with the RCMP’s Specialized Response Unit in Whitehorse, but in October 2011 her last name was McQuarrie and she was with the Major Crimes Unit. It was in that capacity that she travelled to Dawson City on October 22 to take part in the investigation into the arrest and shooting of Mark McDiarmid.

McDiarmid, then 32 years old, had been tracked to the North Fork Road off the Dempster Highway and captured after he drove his truck over a spike belt and had to pull off the road on the Dempster.

He was shot three times by RCMP Constables Jeff Nielsen and David Marentette when he allegedly ran at them brandishing a splitting maul after throwing a jar filled with an oily chemical substance at their SUV, designated 10 Alpha 1, in which they had pursued him.

Manweiller testified that examination of the remains of the mason jar had determined it was filled with a mixture of “oil and an ignitable fluid”. Other such jars, found in McDiarmid’s red flatbed pickup truck, contained similar mixtures, each with a black cloth on both the exterior and interior of the jars.

Crown Prosecutor David McWhinnie indicated that McDiarmid had agreed to stipulate that he was in

possession of such jars, and the defendant replied “Sure” when asked by Justice Elizabeth Hughes if this was the case.

McWhinnie went on to quiz Manweiller about a number of evidence items taken from the scene, which were contained in either brown evidence bags or clear plastic bags.

These included

- a shard of glass from the jar that hit the windshield
- a piece of glass bottle lodged in the lightbar on the top of the SUV
- the lid ring and metal cap from a mason jar
- three bullet casings
- the mushroomed slug that was later removed from McDiarmid at the Dawson Health Centre

McWhinnie, cognizant of McDiarmid’s assertions that various elements of the evidence have been altered or fabricated, was particular in quizzing Manweiller about what happened to the bullet bits.

The constable testified that the casings and the slug had been turned over to the Alberta Serious Incident Response Team without any opportunity for them to have been tampered with by anyone at the local detachment.

The shooters’ pistols were removed from their duty belts and also turned over to ASIRT.

Manweiller testified that she had examined the spike belt used to flatten McDiarmid’s tires. This was available for inspection if need be, but

was back in service at the detachment.

She was aware of McDiarmid’s clothing, but that was handled by another officer.

In his cross examination McDiarmid relied heavily on use of Auxiliary Constable Jayce Murtagh’s video, shot on October 21, and a number of still pictures, attempting to make the point that some of the items Manweiller had taken charge of on the 22nd didn’t appear to be visible on the previous night, suggesting that they had been placed there after the fact.

Manweiller said she had not been there the night before and could not comment on what was or wasn’t there based on a somewhat shaky video and some poorly focussed pictures. She did manage to pick out the splitting maul and some pieces of the mason jar.

The Justice objected to this line of questioning, saying that the Constable was hardly an expert on video quality. She admonished McDiarmid for the vagueness of his questions, saying, “ This isn’t a guessing game for any witness.”

Hughes also ruled out a line of questioning on firearm details as being outside the constable’s area of expertise and ruled irrelevant some questions McDiarmid wanted to pose about possible perjury by a firearms analyst in another unrelated case.

Manweiller indicated that she had departed the scene late that

afternoon, following behind the tow truck that was hauling

McDiarmid’s pickup back to the Dawson detachment.

## Mason jars appeared to be Molotov Cocktails, says Sgt. Morin

In October 2011 Sergeant David Morin, now in charge of the Dawson Detachment of the RCMP, was a corporal, recently assigned there after postings in Pelly Crossing, Haines Junction and Ross River. At the time of the events of October 19 and 20 he had had one previous dealing with Mark McDiarmid, having transported him as far as Stewart Crossing on an occasion when McDiarmid was sent to Whitehorse.

On the dates in question, Morin was on restricted administrative duty, recovering from a recent surgery, doing mostly desk work that required him to “lift no more than ten pounds” he told Crown Council Jennifer Grandy as his testimony began on February 5, 2015.

McDiarmid, now 36 years old, is on trial, accused of damaging a police car, three counts of assaulting a police officer, one count of possessing a dangerous weapon, two

counts of assaulting an officer with a weapon and two counts of attempted murder of a police officer. He is acting in his own defense.

On October 19 Morin was informed by Sergeant Dave Wallace that McDiarmid had assaulted his RCMP vehicle, designated 1 Alpha 3, with a sledge hammer, smashing a headlight and the windshield, as well as denting a fender. These offences added to the warrant that Wallace had found McDiarmid to talk with him about on that day.

On the next day, six members of the force set out in three vehicles to find McDiarmid and either resolve the matter or bring him in. Morin, in plain clothes, travelled with Auxiliary Constable Jayce Murtagh, also in plain clothes, driving in his truck. The other members were in official SUVs 10 Alpha 1 and 10 Alpha 2.

They knew of three places where the suspect might be; one at Henderson Corner, one on the Hunker Road and a third out on the North Fork Road, branching off from the Dempster Highway. After checking the first location, Morin joined Wallace in 10 Alpha 2 while Const. Jordan McIntyre rode in the truck. They switched back again near the bridge at the beginning of the Dempster Highway before proceeding to the North Fork Road.

The plan was that Morin and Murtagh would essentially reconnoiter the area up the road, posing as hunters, while Wallace and McIntyre took up a position on the Ditch Road, near to the junction, and Constables Jeff Nielsen and David Marentette, driving 10 Alpha 1, found a spot to wait in between the others. As it turned out, this central position became the communications link between the three pairs as the local radio repeaters were unable to allow them to broadcast intelligibly for any distance on the police band, though they were able to receive. They were able to relay messages through 10 Alpha 1 on the truckers’ band.

Morin described how they located where they thought McDiarmid was, driving back and forth past the bush road several times and finally parking at a distance where they could see without being seen. They were passed by a couple of vehicles going in both directions, but did not talk to anyone. After some hours they heard a vehicle, which they believed was McDiarmid’s red flat bed pickup, emerge from that road, though they didn’t actually see him.

Not too long after that they heard Marentette on the radio saying that the truck had passed 10 Alpha 1, had seen them and was speeding up. They began to follow at a careful night driving speed on that road, and so they were not at the junction when the pursuit

ended.

They heard that McDiarmid had driven over a spike belt laid across the road by McIntyre and that he had stopped shortly after rounding the corner on to the Dempster Highway.

They heard Marentette say “he’s bailing” and then they heard someone say, “shots fired, shots fired.”

By the time they reached the corner, pulling over before going onto the Dempster, McDiarmid was being given first aid by a couple of members and McIntyre had been dispatched in 10 Alpha 1 to reach a point where he would be able to radio to an ambulance.

The pair had both a digital camera and a video camera in the truck, and Morin walked the scene taking pictures, while Murtagh shot a short video. Morin said they were concerned that evidence might be obscured or damaged if it should snow or in some other way.

It was while Morin was taking pictures that he first noticed the rim and lid of the mason jar on the ground and later bits of glass. Wallace had left him in charge of the scene when they decided it would be best to take McDiarmid in 10 Alpha 2 to meet the ambulance. He took charge of Nielsen’s and Marentette’s duty belts and put them in separate vehicles to work on their notes of the event.

He then went to examine McDiarmid’s truck, in which he found, among other things, a milk crate with a garbage bag inside it and, inside that, a number of mason jars filled with an oily liquid. Picking one out by the rim he noted that there was a length of thin black cloth outside the jar, leading into it, that the cloth was damp and smelled of oil or gasoline.

Asked by Grandy what he thought they were, he replied, “They looked like Molotov Cocktails.”

McDiarmid rose to object at that point, saying these were a gravel thawing device and that he had prepared a video of how they were used that would clear that matter right up. Justice Elizabeth Hughes reminded him at some volume that he would get to show that when it came time to present his case. The ensuing argument caused her to send out the jury for a break.

When the court resumed, Morin reported how he had taken another look at 10 Alpha 1 after finding the jars, and discovered bits of glass and an oily substance on the windshield. Some days later, on October 25, they located the “wick” from that bottle, surmising that it had stuck to the SUV when the bottle broke and blown off about 300 metres from the scene when McIntyre had gone to make the radio call. He produced the thin strip of black cloth for the jury.

One vehicle coming south of the highway had now been held

up for several hours and Morin let the elderly couple move on. Later a YTG Highways truck approached going north and

it, too, was permitted passage. In both cases they drove by on the side well away from any evidence.

McDiarmid suggests RCMP falsified evidence

Mark McDiarmid’s cross-examination of RCMP Sergeant David Morin began on the morning on Friday, February 6 and concluded on the morning of Monday, February 9, in Dawson City.

Morin had testified to being part of the third pair of officers involved in tracking and apprehending McDiarmid on October 20, 2011. His role, along with Auxiliary Constable Jayce Murtagh, was to determine just where the suspect was on the North Fork Road, just off the Dempster Highway, and maintain as much observation as possible while he was at the woodlot where the detachment believed him to be. As such they were not involved in the chase, the spiking of McDiarmid’s truck’s tires, or the shooting that occurred on the Dempster Highway a few hundred metres north of the North Fork Road.

McDiarmid, now 36 years old, is on trial, accused of damaging a police car, three counts of assaulting a police officer, one count of possessing a dangerous weapon, two counts of assaulting an officer with a weapon and two counts of attempted murder of a police officer. He is acting in his own defense.

Some of these charges relate to things that happened on the night of October 20; others relate to events the day before.

Morin had indicated that he and his partner were passed by two pickup trucks while they were on their stake out. McDiarmid questioned why they had not see any of the water trucks which he claimed were going to the former Viceroy Mine (now operated by Golden Predator) at the end of the road every two hours. Morin replied that he had not seen any on that day or evening.

Regarding Morin’s testimony about the mason jars filled with flammable oil mixtures and fitted out with cloth wicks, McDiarmid questioned which side of the SUV (10 Alpha 1) had been hit with the mason jar he is said to have thrown at it. He claimed the impact was on the passenger’s side of the SUV, but Morin continued to assert that most of the oily smear and the sign of impact was to be found on the driver’s side.

As to the smearing, some of it would have been distributed across the entire window when Constable Jordan McIntyre used that vehicle to travel to

radio range in order to call for the ambulance to assist McDiarmid, who had been shot. The windshield did show signs of the wipers having been used.

McDiarmid, however, advanced the claim that one of the jars Morin found in a milk crate in his truck – he said there should have been ten of these and that one was missing – had been taken by some member of the force and deliberately smashed against the driver’s side of the SUV window in order to falsify the evidence.

Morin denied this, as he did McDiarmid’s claim that this had all taken place while a fake reenactment video of the events prior to his shooting by Constables Jeff Nielsen and David Marentette had been staged to frame him.

All the officers so far have testified that radio transmission on the police band was faulty at that location. They could receive but not transmit and were forced to use the truckers’ band known as LADD 4 to communicate with each other, relaying their radio messages through 10 Alpha 1, which was situated between the other two teams. As that was the case, there exist no radio logs or recordings of these transmissions, as there would have been on the police band.

McDiarmid asked if this was not simply a ploy on the part of the officers to hide the actual contents of their radio discussions. Morin denied that this was the case.

McDiarmid attempted to ask Morin a number of questions about events that the officer could not have observed, as he did not arrive on the site until they were over. Crown Prosecutor Jennifer Grandy objected to some of these questions and Judge Elizabeth Hughes ruled them out of order, along with a number of other lines of questioning.

McDiarmid has continued to attempt to establish that Constable Justin Smith was also present on the 20th, showing a video of him on a patrol on the 18th. Both Morin’s responses and earlier testimony from Wallace and Marentette place Smith at home with an ear infection on the day of the event. His two piece light winter jacket was, however, in 10 Alpha 2 and was used to cover McDiarmid when he was placed in the SUV to keep him warm and more comfortable after he was shot.

Morin admitted to

McDiarmid began his cross examination on Friday morning – a half day for the court – and continued on Monday.

stumbling over names during a statement that he made to the investigating team out of Whitehorse during his interviews with them. He several times said the name Justin and the transcripts show that he immediately corrected himself, making the comment that there were just “too many Js” at the detachment and that he was still fairly new to the place.

At the time the first names at the detachment were Jordan, Justin, Jeff and Jayce, not to mention three officers named David.

McDiarmid has maintained that the RCMP flew over the North Fork area to find him on the 20th. Morin said that this was discussed as a way to scope out the area quickly, but that neither a pilot nor a plane could be found that day, so it did not happen. In his handwritten notes about the day’s events, the 10 code shorthand “10-10” meaning “negative” was marked beside both the pilot and the plane notation.

McDiarmid has maintained from the beginning that someone from the detachment had travelled to the Tintina Trench rest stop that day to look for him from a distance. Morin said this was not true.

There have been some questions about times during the trial so far, and McDiarmid has referred to a 16 minute gap between the readings on the VICS (Vehicle in Camera System) camera and the official transcripts of calls as recorded in Whitehorse. Grandy observed that there do seem to be several different timepieces involved and that they do not all agree.

In particular the VICS’s time display had not been reset properly since the SUV it was in had had its official designation changed from 139 to 10 Alpha 2 and was still showing both the old designation as well as a less than accurate time.

By the time they hit Dawson City on February 11, A.W. (Alexander Wesley) Cardinal and Jasmine Colette had been travelling since well before January 25, when they had played a gig in Prince Rupert before heading up the Alaska Highway.

The duo performs as Blue Moon Marquee and the Yukon portion of their tour is under the banner of the Home Routes association. They've performed several concerts in and around Whitehorse, Mayo, Atlin, Old Crow and Inuvik, with the only disappointment being that the deep cold on February 5th kept them from Watson Lake.

What you realize right way when this duo begins to perform is that Cardinal does not require a microphone in the confines of anyone's living room. ## The stigma of mental illness

One of the last examples of widespread institutionalized discrimination

KELOWNA, BC/ Troy Media/ - Getting treatment for a mental illness is often a lot more difficult than simply calling up your doctor and making an appointment. For many people it involves a painful process of accepting that they have a problem and being willing to expose themselves.

Many people who come to be treated for the first time say they have put off treatment for several years because of fear. They fear the reactions of their co-workers, friends or family - of being seen as weak, strange or overly dramatic. If

it's not the reactions of others they fear, it is often the shame of feeling like a dependent on therapy or medication that keeps them away.

Sometimes, the fear of people's reactions is simply perception, but the reality is that mental illness is stigmatized in our society. In fact, mental illness is one of the last examples of widespread institutionalized discrimination just as race and gender have been in the past.

Mental illness is recognized to affect a large portion of the population from all walks of life. The World Health Organization tells us it is the second leading cause of disability and premature death worldwide - outstripping cancer and second only to heart disease. Still, in both Canada and the United States, insurance companies can openly and legally impose treatment limitations for mental illness that differ significantly from limits on all other medical conditions.

Because of real and perceived stigma, mental illnesses are severely under-treated. Of the people diagnosed with depression, only about 10 per cent seek treatment. Depression affects approximately 20 per cent of the population at some point during their life and this under treatment leaves a significant number of people to deal with it on their own.

Unfortunately, those who are left untreated are doing themselves and society a disservice. Not only do untreated mental illnesses result in

higher use of non-psychiatric medical services, they cost businesses billions of dollars every year in lost wages, lower productivity and increased use of sick and disability leave.

Untreated depression can mean a person is dealing with more than the characteristic feelings of hopelessness, helplessness and worthlessness. It is also bad for an individual's overall physical health.

Research shows that once you have had a heart attack, your chance of dying from cardiovascular disease is four to six times greater if you also suffer from depression. Depression is an independent risk factor for heart disease just like high cholesterol, obesity or smoking.

Other disorders that worsen with depression include cancer, diabetes, epilepsy and osteoporosis. Diabetics are twice as likely to be depressed

as others and those who are depressed are twice as likely to suffer complications of diabetes such as heart disease, nerve damage and blindness. Depression more than triples the likelihood of dying in the 10 years after a stroke. These complications can be avoided by being treated with antidepressants.

It is important to realize that while our societal stereotypes are discriminatory, mental illness is not. It can affect anyone of any walk of life, background, ethnic group, educational status or religion.

If you think you suffer from a mental illness, resist succumbing to stigma and ask your doctor about getting treatment.

Customers in communities serviced by satellite may experience noise or service interruptions between 2:22 and 2:59 P.M. Eastern Standard Time, beginning February 22 and ending March 7. The exact timing depends on a community's geographic location and the position of the satellite providing service. Disruptions are very short—typically lasting just a few minutes—and it is not uncommon for the effects to go unnoticed.

Sun transit disruptions occur for several days semi-annually, around the spring and fall equinoxes, when the telecommunications satellite passes directly between Northwestel's satellite ground stations and the sun. When this occurs, radio frequency noise from the sun is stronger than the desired signal from the satellite, resulting in a brief degradation of service.



# Let’s avoid emergencies, says Dawson’s Public Works Superintendent

During the last week in January there was another emergency at Dawson’s Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). While there was some water involved at the beginning of the problem, it was electricity that could have made a smaller matter suddenly become very serious.

Mayor Wayne Potoroka referred to the potential for damage in this case as “that worst thing that we all know about” during the February 10 meeting of council, but didn’t go much further than that, deferring to Superintendent of Public Works Norm Carlson, who sat for an interview later in the week.

Carlson explained that water lines for the fire suppression system and for water use at the WWTP goes above the ceiling through a minimally heated room in the plant that also contains a large master electrical panel.

This panel not only controls systems in the WWTP, but is also tied into the pump house that keeps water moving in

Dawson’s water lines, to the standby generator for the facility and to the pumps at the wells. The water and sewer system that was installed for Dawson by the territorial government decades ago, which was experimental at that time, requires constant water flows in order to keep the town’s very cold water (which actually has to be warmed before it circulates) from freezing.

When the water line above the ceiling broke, the water came spurting down around the fixture that was the sprinkler from the fire suppression system. That was located almost directly over the large electrical panel, which also contains circuit breakers for all the systems. It soaked the outer metal of the panel and froze the doors shut.

That was one of those weeks with the average temperature in Dawson was in the minus 40s. The water that collected on the floor from this leak froze solid and had it risen any higher would have got inside the panel and frozen there, as the panel is not terribly waterproof.

‘We did manage to detect it and shut it down before it got

any worse than it was,” Carlson said.

“If it had taken the panel out then we would have lost the power to our wells and to the wastewater plant. There could be damage to the panel and this is all very specialized equipment so there are no spares here. There would have been damage to the plant.”

Ultimately, he said, if the situation persisted and there was no way to get things going properly again, that “worst thing: the mayor had referred to could have been a massive freeze-up of the town’s water system.

“At 40 below that’s an extremely scary proposition.”

He said the mains, which are buried, would probably not freeze too quickly, but the feeder lines to every home and business would be at risk quite soon. It is because of their vulnerability that Dawsonites need to keep bleeder lines running about eight months of the year.

A situation like this would make the annoyance of the week-long boil water order that followed the sewage discharge emergency in early December

seem like a trivial matter by comparison.

Carlson has since insisted that the sprinkler be removed from the room.

“It’s an accident waiting to happen,” he said. “It may meet code, but it’s not realistic here. If it – no when it – malfunctions, because everything does eventually, it could fill the panel with water and cause that damage whether it was freezing or not.”

They got into the panel with a crowbar and were thankful to find there was no damage.

“We didn’t know what we were going to find. It might

have been just an ice cube in there. We had to have the Yukon Energy Corp. over to check the panel and see that it was still good. If it wasn’t they’d have shut down the plant.

“It’s not a good situation to be in and I can tell you it’s scary as hell from where I sit. We’re getting these close calls – and I hate close calls. I would much rather see planning in place to prevent that type of response. The whole thing with emergencies is – let’s avoid them.”

Next summer when the three new wells come on line, they will have their own electrical systems and panels.

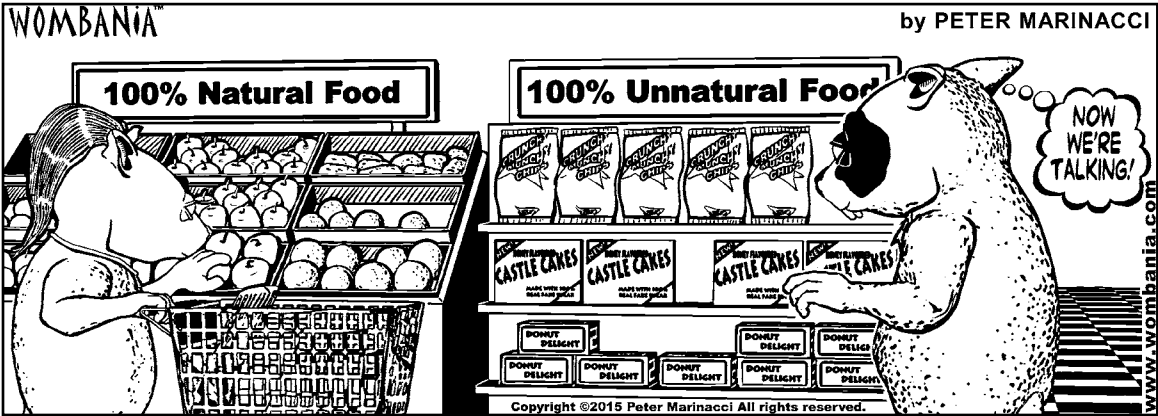

# Spell to Bring Lost Creatures home casts a spell at KIAC

The Odd Fellows Ballroom came alive with spooky creatures and shimmering shadow play on February 15 as Christine Fellows and Shary Boyle brought their fascinating production of *Spell to Bring Lost Creatures Home* to a packed and receptive audience.

The pair emerged at first as life size puppets themselves, decked out in a horse's head and the outline of a house, but the focus soon shifted to the screen, where Boyle used an old fashioned overhead projector and a masterful collection of hand crafted transparencies to project both still and moving scenes.

These were sometimes silent, sometimes accompanied by Fellows, either chanting or singing, a variety of songs to either tell a story or set a mood.

Boyle's vignettes are structured as if they are being seen through a window. Some of the scenes were static, some had moving parts, and some were animated by hand as the stories unfolded.

The slides depicted wolves, gatherings of animals, children's imaginings, scenery, creatures of both land and sea, as well as people in boats on the ocean and skidoos on land or

frozen lake. Boyle and Fellows have been collaborating since 2005. In 2012 their show *Everything Under the Moon* played at the Enwave Theatre at Toronto's Harbourfront Centre. What was said of that show in the Globe and Mail could easily

apply to the present offering: "... the storytelling is utterly captivating. You emerge from this show as if waking from a dream." They will be touring this new show throughout 2015.

# Taking all the time in the world to look at life

From August 2010, as the Klondike was slowly edging towards winter, until the following June 2011, when the summer season was once again in full bloom, the Parsons/Crocker family removed themselves from the comfort of their two story, spacious, country residential home on Mary McLeod Road in Dawson City and travelled 150 kilometres up river to an 18 by 18 foot cabin on the far side of the river.

Gerard and Suzanne had done it before the kids came along, back "in 1997 as she recalls it, but were hankering to do it again for an extended period with the kids, while they were still young enough to enjoy it the most. At the time, Sam was 10, Kate was 8 and Tess was 4.

One of the results of this nine month experiment at going back to the land was a documentary film called "All the Time in the World – Disconnecting to Reconnect".

"Deciding to go into the bush came first," Suzanne said. "It was not meant to be a film project.

Life had been getting more and more hectic, or so it seemed, and both Gerard and Suzanne felt the need to simplify life and have a change of pace, to get away from the schedules, clocks, computers and calculators.

So why make a film?  
"It was basically the tremendous curiosity from people down south," she said, "when we told them what we were doing that made me think, 'hmmm, there's a lot of interest in this; I should take a camera.'"

That meant figuring out in advance what she would need to take in order to be able to do a decent job. The eventually turned out to be a good camera, sound recording equipment, several boat batteries and an inverter, and a small generator (after the batteries turned out to discharge too soon), lots of SIM cards, and a laptop computer with some external drives to download the SIMs to.

For the actual living, there was a wood stove, candles, kerosene lanterns and propane lights.

As the film notes, they went out there to get away from distractions, so Suzanne had to devise a balancing act between making a documentary and not being distracted by the process and ruining the experience.

"One of the great things about the footage that I have is that my family ignored the camera. They were just themselves, au naturel; they didn't change to a different person when the camera came out. I think

that's why the film has been so successful."

One of the few times the family got to see what had been filmed was at Christmas that year.

"We made things for each other. I took some of the footage that I had and edited into a little film and that was my present to my family in the bush."

That was also the point at which she realized this really could work and she as going to end up with more than just a really a home movie.

The only other time the family as a whole used the equipment was Easter weekend, when the Dawson City International Film Festival happens.

"We couldn't go to the festival, so we took a break from home schooling for two weeks and had our own little film school and film festival."

Back in Dawson the family had a tradition of a weekly movie night. In the bush this turned into a weekly story telling night. They would dictate these into a small audio recorder to get ready for the event.

"Then we would make a big pot of popcorn on the wood stove and sit around and listen to their stories. They got to be pretty good story tellers."

Over the nine months she shot about 500 hours of footage, which it took her about three years to turn into an 88 minute film.

"It's a lot of footage. I'm sure I could have made 10 movies."

The film was screened first at the Vancouver International Film Festival and Crocker was really worried that this unknown film from the Yukon, without much press or promotion, would get any kind of an audience. There was a way to monitor the tickets online, and it just seemed like forever before she could tell there were going to be people coming to see her work.

Luckily the Vancouver branch of CPAWS chose to promote All the Time in the World, and in the event, she was pleasantly surprised by a full house for both screenings in a 350 seat theatre. Sitting at the back of the room she found that people weren't fidgeting, or shuffling their feet; they were laughing in all the right places (and in some she hadn't thought of). Better yet, for both screenings most people stayed for the Q&A session with the director and the family.

"My whole family was down there. We all came up of stage for the Q&A and they asked the kids lots of insightful questions. They did an amazing job speaking into a microphone in front of 350 strangers.

"At the end of the second screening, after the Q&A, we had a standing ovation, which was also totally heartwarming. You couldn't ask for anything better."

One thing that sticks in Crocker's mind is that the volunteer projectionist sat through the whole first screening instead of leaving when his shift was over, waited for the Q&A to end, and then came forward. He said his shift was to have ended about 10 minutes into the run, but he got caught by the film and stayed.

"He said it was his favorite film of the festival," a sentiment with which a lot of other people agreed.

The upshot was that the film won the Audience Choice Award for most popular Canadian Documentary at the VIFF.

Since then it has screened at six festivals, including its Yukon premier at the Available Light Film Festival and has won awards at four of the six, including three Audience Choice Awards and one Best of the Festival jury Award.

That last one was at the Wild and Scenic Film Festival, an environmental film festival in Nevada City, California in January 2015.

It has even won awards where it hasn't been shown.

"It co-won the Harold Greenberg Fund Green Screen Award at the Planet in Focus film festival in Toronto in November, although it did not screen there. The award is presented to the film that demonstrates low environmental impact in the making of the film.

"ATTITW co-won the award with Disney Studios (!) for their film Tomorrowland which will be released in May and stars George Clooney. Disney produced that film with zero waste! Imagine - a Dawson film in the same sentence as Disney!"

Then, of course, there was the recent ALFF, where it won the Audience Choice Award for Best Canadian Documentary at the Available Light Film Festival earlier in February.

The film hasn't been seen in Dawson yet, and at 88 minutes it's too long to fit into the program for the Dawson

City International Short Film Festival on Easter Weekend, but I will be shown as part of a long program on the evening before the festival begins, on April 2.

After that, it's headed to the Reel 2 Real International Youth Film Festival in Vancouver April 10- 17, overlapping a four day theatrical run at the VanCity theatre in Vancouver - April 12- 15.

The other places it will be screening are: Portland, Minneapolis St. Paul, Mexico, Santiago Chile, the Canary Islands and South Africa, and it has just been accepted to be screened at a festival in Israel later on this year.

Film making is rarely a solitary process, and there is a list of production people and advisors, including Michael Parfit, who edited the film, and Nettie Wild, who edited the story, along with Carrie Gadsby.

Crocker also wants to give a lot of credit to folks at home.

"I would really like to acknowledge the important role Dawson has played in the creation of this film.

"It is due to the many opportunities this community offers in the arts, especially through KIAC, and the support

and mentorship I have had from many of Dawson's great filmmakers, especially Lulu

Keating and Dan Sokolowski, that I have gathered the skills to be able to create a feature film. I am especially proud to be presenting this Dawson made film south of the border and have it so well received!"

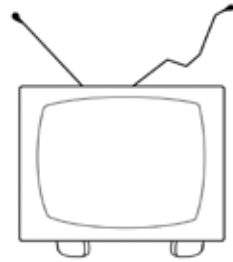

When Canada  
almost fell apart

*The Morning After: The  
1995 Quebec Referendum  
and the Day that Almost  
Was*

With the recent Quebec provincial election having shown that the citizens of that province have so thoroughly rejected the call of the Parti Québécois, at least for now, this is perhaps a good time to look back at a time when the separatist option was riding high and almost managed to win the day.

The results of the October 30, 1995 referendum could have given our nation the worst Hallowe’en ever if the vote had tipped just a little bit. As it was, 50.58% of the citizens voted against the vaguely worded question put to them, and 49.42% voted in favour of that same question.

*“Do you agree that Quebec should become sovereign after having made a formal offer to Canada for a new economic and political partnership within the scope of the bill respecting the future of Quebec and of the agreement signed on June 12, 1995?”*

That might mean immediate separation, or the beginning of negotiations to lead to that result. It turns out that even the three men leading the charge had quite different intentions when it came to what the morning after a successful campaign would look like.

Chantal Hébert, with the assistance of Jean LaPierre has delved into this topic by interviewing 17 key players from that period. From the Yes Camp there are Lucien Bouchard, the evangelist for the movement, Mario Dumont, the somewhat reluctant player, and Jacques Parizeau, the chess master behind the event.

Parizeau could not sell the idea himself, so Bouchard was brought on board as a front man, and his presence nearly clinched the deal. It turns out, however, that he had a softer option in mind than the Quebec Premier and that both he and Dumont would have been in for a shock had the Yes Camp have won.

In Quebec, the No Camp was led by Lucienne Robillard, Jean Charest and Daniel Johnson. They put up a not terribly effective opposition.

The Feds, who were not necessarily united in their approach, included Sheila Copps, Brian Tobin, Paul Martin, Raymond Chrétien, André Ouellet and Preston Manning. Some changed opinions during

the debate, Manning would happily have negotiated Quebec’s departure.

Not all the premiers were involved. Roy Romanow seems to have been the one man in the debate with the sense of urgency to develop contingency plans. Other players included Mike Harris, Frank McKenna and Bob Rae.

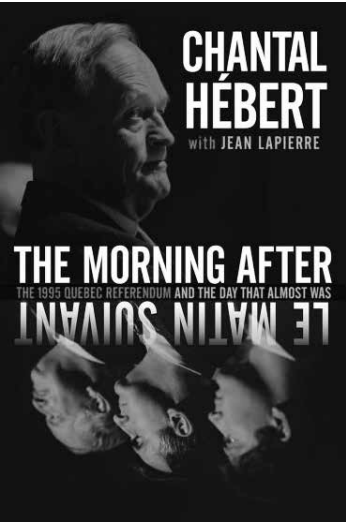
Prime Minister Jean Chrétien gets the last word and Hébert refers to him as the Conjurer.

What we learn is that there was no consensus on the Yes side as to what victory might mean for them. Parizeau would have taken it to mean “independence now” while the other two would have settled for a restructured federal state.

Those who were fighting for the No vote were almost too late to the game. At first they didn’t know what to make of the referendum, but seemed to be sure they would win it easily. Then, as Bouchard’s presence lit a fire under the campaign for the Yes side, they panicked, and really did not seem to have a coherent plan of action.

On both sides, no one was talking to anyone else, and if Parizeau was playing his cards close to his chest, Chrétien’s were just as well concealed. He made some last minute concessions that may have helped the cause; but the Sponsorship Scandal connected to the ongoing debate, that later brought down the government of his successor, Paul Martin, also unfolded mostly on his watch.

Hébert is familiar to CBC watchers as a regular member of the At Issue weekly panel on The National. In English she holds forth in the *Toronto Star* and in Quebec she appears in several publications.



Jean LaPierre has seen both sides of the issue. He was an MP in John Turner’s short-lived government, then joined Bouchard in founding the Bloc Québécois and ultimately came back to the Liberals under Paul Martin. Today he is a radio commentator on a couple of Quebec radio stations.

The book concludes with a series of short takes from each writer on how they met and interacted with all the people they interviewed for this book over the time they have known them.

To provide context, the book begins with a useful timeline of events between November 1976, when René Lévesque first led the Parti Québécois to power, up to the 2014 election which saw the minority government of Pauline Marois go down to defeat.

This is an excellent book and very good reading, but it does leave me a little worried. We would like to think that those who wish to lead us are a bit better organized than a bunch of kids on a playground playing let’s pretend, but it seems it’s not the case.
